Introduction

Scarborough Borough Council has set up the Housing Options Service to improve the services that are offered to individual people and families, who are at risk of losing their home, and to increase the extent to which we can prevent homelessness from occurring.

Through the Housing Options service, we will work with anyone who considers they are threatened with homelessness to review their current housing circumstances and advise them of the housing options available to them, and to work with them to come up with a suitable plan to prevent the threat of homelessness.

This leaflet is for anyone who considers that they are either homeless or threatened with homelessness within 56 days, and explains:

- The housing options that may be available to you
- How we can work with you to develop a suitable plan personalised to vou, in order to prevent or relieve the homelessness.
- Other services available to you, in addition to Housing Options, to ensure you are getting the most accurate information for your circumstances.

Difficulties with your mortgage

If you are a homeowner and are running in to difficulties with your mortgage, the Housing Options team may also be able to help. You should always engage with your mortgage lender in order to keep them updated regarding your circumstances. We can also refer you for budgeting assistance in order to maximise your income and lessen your outgoings.

In certain circumstances we can also assist with a small targeted loan in order to help homeowners get through a set period of financial difficulties or in order to allow time for a managed sale of the property to go through.

This possible assistance is called the Yorkshire and Humber Breathing Space Scheme. There are certain criteria that need to be met before assistance can be offered, including not being in negative equity with your secured loans.

How you can help

- By contacting Housing Options as soon as you think you are at risk of becoming homeless.
- Keeping in touch This will make it easier for everyone if you answer calls, respond to any letters, messages you receive and letting us know if there are any changes to your circumstances, or if you cannot make any appointments.
- Bring all the relevant documents with you when you come to your assessment.
- Give us as much accurate information as possible about your housing circumstances.
- Be realistic. Unfortunately, we are not always able to arrange the housing solution that you would want us to, but we will always try to make it as straightforward as we possibly can.

What the service can offer you

Scarborough Borough Council has a duty to take "reasonable steps" (which vary for each individual's/ family's circumstances) to prevent the homelessness of anyone eligible and threatened with homelessness.

It is also a requirement that Scarborough Borough Council takes reasonable steps to help homeless applicants to secure suitable accommodation.

All eligible applicants will be required to attend an assessment, where they will develop a personalised housing plan, with their Housing Options Officer, which will include specific actions that need to be completed by either the applicant or the Officer. The actions will be decided and agreed by both parties, in order to ensure the best plan is put in place to try to prevent the risk of homelessness as quickly as possible.

The Prevention Team, within Housing Options, will work with the Applicants to help them obtain all of the actions set out on their personalised housing plan. The Prevention Team can help with the likes of finding alternative private rented accommodation and arranging viewings and, if needed, accompanying applicants to these viewings. In some cases we are able to prevent homelessness by helping you remain in your own home. This can be best achieved if you get advice early so that the problem has not developed to such a degree that homelessness cannot be avoided.

They can assist by liaising with other Organisations that the applicant is working with in order to prevent or relieve their homelessness. They can provide assistance with money towards the cost of a bond (conditions apply) in order for the applicant to be able to move into alternative accommodation.
