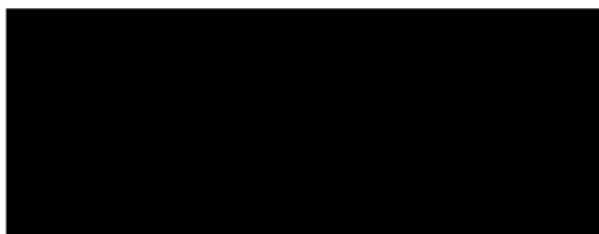
Similarly, we see many other people of all ages exercising dogs from the early morning until dusk, boys and girls playing ball sports and families flying kites.

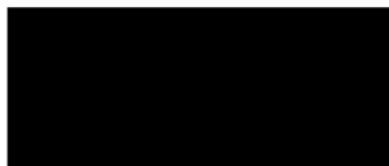

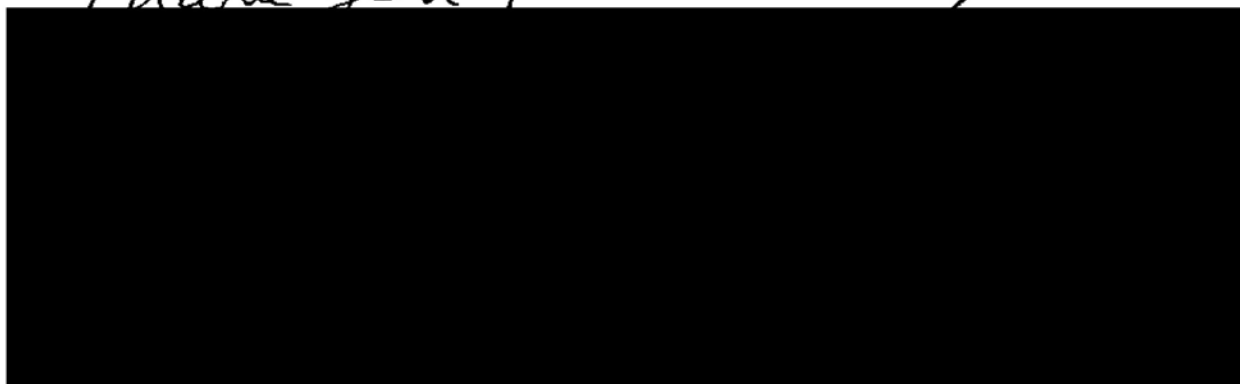



Protecting The Oriel

I understand that you are working with others to try and secure the long term future of the Oriel Cricket Ground as an open space for use by the local community. I would just like to add my voice to those already supporting your initiative.

I have lived adjacent to the cricket ground for almost 35 years and during that time I have been witness to the wide variety of activities which have taken place on the site.

When my late wife and I first arrived in Oriel Crescent in 1988, there were 3 Cricket teams playing regularly on the Ground and there were matches most weekends, and midweek evenings, during the season. It was a lovely thing to regularly be able to sit and watch these games unfold on a summer's evening. During that period there was a high standard of grounds maintenance by and for the cricketers which also served to encourage others to regularly use the close-mown space for other informal sporting pastimes; such as playing cricket, football and rugby; golf; kite flying; or just running around. In addition, the Ground has always been used by local people for informal recreational pursuits such as picnicking, children's play, walking, sitting and sunbathing. Despite its earlier formal use for cricket, there was never any impediment to anyone wishing to use the space at other times. People were free to use the Ground at their leisure.

With a large proportion of the many flats around Oriel Crescent having no private gardens, the Ground has also increasingly played a role as their open amenity space. (Such use was particularly noticeable during the Covid lockdown). So family groups are a regular sight, especially on fine days.

For many years a local nursery has brought their young charges to the Ground as a clean and well-maintained space where they can play and run around in a safe environment. From time to time there are occasional formal events (fun days) organised by and for the local community. Finally, and probably most significantly, the Ground was and remains a very popular daily destination for a large number of people who visit regularly to exercise their dogs.

Although recent years has seen the steady demise of all three cricket teams, so there are now only occasional competitive games, all of the other activities I describe have continued on the Ground to this day.

During my considerable time in residence on the street, all of this activity has gone on uninterrupted and, as far as I am aware, no one has ever been denied entry or prevented from going on to the Ground as and when they wished to.

I am also aware from many of my neighbours how much this beautiful open space means to them and their community and the value they put upon it. In any conversation about the locality, the desire to see the Ground remain available for public use is always a fundamental issue

So, I applaud the efforts of you and the other Friends of the Oriel Cricket & Recreation Ground for looking after this beautiful part of our neighbourhood; and I fully support this initiative to secure Town Green status so that we might continue to enjoy the significant amenity which the Ground provides for us all.

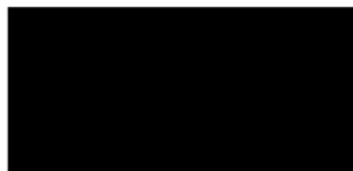

We moved as a family of four from Hull to Scarborough in 2007. As we looked for a suitable property offering local amenities that would meet our needs, we were surprised how few green 'family-orientated' spaces we could find in comparison to those we regularly made use of in Hull.

I was drawn to the house that we currently live in specifically because of the cricket ground. With then toddler twins, we needed an uninterrupted flat space for them to be able to run and more importantly be seen by one watchful adult at all times. Wooded areas for example would require much closer supervision and not give the children the sense of freedom that they experienced during trips to the cricket ground from October 2007 onwards. The fact that the semi-circle had a well-maintained boundary wall with working gates was also perfect for that extra layer of reassurance. As a family we have always known that if we needed more space than our small back garden provided (for example if the children had friends to play) then the cricket ground would come into its own. Our children, who are now classed as adults, enjoyed the fact that they could go to 'the field' as they called it and be close enough to get home in seconds should there be a problem. We have always viewed 'the field' as an extension of our home.

Over the past 15 years we have enjoyed watching others engage in good-natured leisure activities, ranging from scout groups, community run fetes, local playgroup sporting afternoons and not forgetting enthusiastically played amateur cricket matches. Even during these activities, the ground has been large enough to house all. There has never been a time when any particular group has dominated the space and stopped others entering. My son has particularly enjoyed playing football over the years with friends old and new, none more so when the COVID regulations were relaxed and groups were allowed to exercise together.

In 2019 we acquired a dog. She is a very nervous dog sadly, but fortunately we feel able to let her run free on the cricket ground, safe in the knowledge that the walls and gates will keep her from running into the road. This is the only area in Scarborough that we feel able to do this. It is evident that many people exercise their dogs on the ground daily, sometimes with the same parties visiting three or four times a day. Pet owners stop and chat, obviously with the open space providing socialising opportunities for humans as well as animals. The cricket ground is an absolute gift for local dog owners and this is reinforced by the amount of 'walkers' that arrive from further afield by car.

Not only do I feel that the ground offers a safe place to walk, rest and play, thanks mostly to our dedicated neighbours, but simply passing by, multiple times a day and looking at it against the backdrop of Oliver's Mount and the war memorial gives me an enormous sense of well-being. Throughout the pandemic we would often reflect as a family about how incredibly lucky we are to live in such attractive and spacious surrounds.

In short, the cricket ground has played a huge, positive role in our family life to date and in years to come we sincerely hope to be able to make use of this hidden gem of a space with our future generations.

I have also exercised my dogs on the Oriel over the years and in doing so have made many friends.


It is lovely to see the children coming up from the nursery to have playtime in the Oriel. They love to run around and have fun. Again it would be awful if they lost this facility.

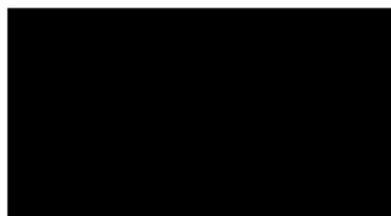
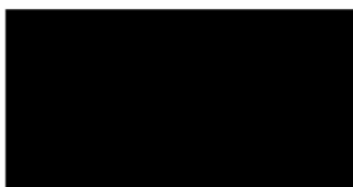

I have never been prohibited in using this green and value it as there are no other facilities in which are near to me which can be used.


