

## Community Governance Review - Osgodby

On 1 April 2023 Scarborough Borough Council will be dissolved to be replaced by the new North Yorkshire Council. On that date Charter Trustees will be established for the unparished parts of Scarborough town which will ensure the continuation of Mayoral and other ceremonial functions, but would not have powers to deliver any services.

If a town or parish council is established, the Charter Trustee areas would be dissolved. If there is no new town or parish council the Charter Trustees will continue and only be abolished if a parish council is created in the future.

There are three properties at the southern end of the unparished area, at Osgodby. Residents in those properties may feel they identify better with Osgodby Parish Council, than the currently unparished Scarborough Town area.

## Charter trustee / parish council

**Option 1 - To create a parish council for the unparished part of Scarborough town centre and include the three unparished houses in Osgodby within it.** The parish council would provide local services and take over the ceremonial functions of the charter trustees who would dissolve.

**Option 2 - The three unparished houses become part of Osgodby Parish Council and the unparished part of Scarborough town centre becomes a separate parish.** The newly created Scarborough town centre parish would provide local services and take over ceremonial functions of the charter trustees who would dissolve.

**Option 3 - To leave Scarborough town centre and the three houses in Osgodby unparished.** The charter trustee would remain in place and continue to undertake ceremonial functions only.

**Option 4 - The three unparished houses become part of Osgodby Parish Council and the unparished part of Scarborough town centre remains unparished.** The charter trustee would continue to undertake ceremonial functions only for the unparished part of Scarborough town centre.
