Population

Geographical Barriers to Services

Part of the Indices of Deprivation 2019, the Geographical Barriers to Service subdomain ranks all Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in England in terms of road distances to services including a GP surgery, supermarket or convenience store, primary school and post office.


Large areas of North Yorkshire are covered by LSOAs within the most deprived 20% in England for this measure.



Population density (people per sq km, ONS MYE 2019)



- Population density is higher than the North Yorkshire average but considerably lower than that of England overall.
- Outside of the main towns of Scarborough, Whitby and Filey much of the district is covered by areas which fall within the 20% most deprived neighbourhoods (Lower Super Output Areas) in England in terms of Geographical Barriers to Services. 26.1% of the population live in these very rural areas.
- 1.4% of the LSOAs in Scarborough are within the 10% most deprived in North Yorkshire for this indicator.
- 27.5% of the population are aged 65+, higher than the national average (18.4%) and higher than the North Yorkshire average (24.7%).
- This is expected to increase to 35.0% by 2035 while for North Yorkshire as a whole the proportion is expected to increase to 32.2%.
- Life expectancy at birth is 78.1 years for males and 82.6 years for females, 2.6 and 1.6 years shorter than the North Yorkshire averages respectively.



Health


- 324 people aged 18-64 are thought to have a moderate or severe learning disability in 2020.
- This is expected to fall to 312 by 2035.
- For those aged 65+ the number is expected to increase from 85 to 109 people over the same period.
- These figures are based on national rates applied to the population of the district.
- 410 people have an open service with a Primary Support Reason (PSR) of Learning Disability (Q4 2020/21).



Population aged 18-64 predicted to have a serious personal care disability



- 583 people aged 18-64 have a serious personal care disability in 2020. This is expected to fall to 533 people by 2035.
- These figures are based on national rates from PANSI which have been applied to the population of the district.
- 972 clients have a PSR of either physical or sensory support (Q4 2020/21).
- Of those, 876 are for Personal Care. A further 69 are for Access and Mobility Only and an additional 27 are for Sensory Support.
- 55.2% of dementia cases aged 65+ are estimated to have been diagnosed (PHE, 2020).
- This is below the national and North Yorkshire averages and is the lowest rate in the county.
- The number of people aged 65+ with dementia is expected to increase from 2,077 in 2020 to 2,934 by 2035 (POPPI).
- 241 clients have a recorded health condition of dementia, 165 of whom are in permanent placements (Q4 2020/21, LLA).
- 38 providers are currently approved to provide dementia care across the Scarborough, Whitby & Ryedale locality (Q4 2020/21).

Dementia diagnosis rate (age 65+), 2020 (% of estimated cases)




Public Health England Profile - key issues for adult social care

- Of those aged 17+ with diabetes, 71.2% are estimated to have been diagnosed. This is significantly below the national average (78.0%) in 2018.
- The suicide rate was 16.0 per 100k aged 10+ (2017-19) above the North Yorkshire average (12.3)

Hospital Discharges

Hospital discharge pathways (rate per 10,000 adults) by Command Centre 2020/21




- 106.8 people per 10,000 adults were discharged from hospital to home with social care input in the Scarborough Command Centre area in 2020/21, on the Home First Pathway 1.
- This equates to 953 clients the largest number and the highest rate in North Yorkshire.
- A further 204 people were discharged to a short-term, bed-based setting (Pathway 2) while 355 were discharged to a care setting to meet complex needs (Pathway 3).


Provision

- 55 approved residential and nursing care providers operate with Scarborough district.
- 83.3% of those providers who have received a CQC rating were rated good or outstanding Q4 2020/21. This is slightly lower than the county average (83.7%).

% Residential & nursing locations rated Good or Outstanding (Q4 2020/21)




% Domiciliary care providers rated Good or Outstanding (Q4 2020/21)




- 32 approved domiciliary care providers operate within Scarborough district
- 64.9% of those providers who have received a CQC rating were rated good or outstanding in Q4 2020/21. This is the lowest rate in North Yorkshire and considerably lower than the county average (72.9%).
- There are 42 residential homes (898 beds) and 13 nursing homes (457 beds) across Scarborough district (Q4 2020/21).
- Across the Scarborough, Whitby & Ryedale locality residential homes have an occupancy rate of 95% (55 vacancies) while nursing homes have an occupancy rate of 91% (48 vacancies) in Q4 2020/21.
- The number of people aged 65+ living in a care home with or without nursing is projected to increase from 995 in 2020 to 1,460 by 2035, a 46.7% increase (POPPI), the lowest rate of increase in the county.

Services


Open weekly services per 1,000 pop aged 65+ (Q4 2020)




- 37.2 people per 1,000 aged 65+ receive a service in Q4 2020/21, the highest rate in the county.
- This equates to 1,115 people accessing care.
- The rate increases to 62.9 at age 75+ and to 126.0 at age 85+, all of which are the highest rates in the county.
- There are 81.1 domiciliary care cases per 10,000 adults, the highest rate in the county and considerably higher than the North Yorkshire average of 55.3.
- There are 6 unsourced domiciliary care packages in the Scarborough, Whitby & Ryedale locality in Q4 2020/21. Across the county 35 packages are unsourced.

- 15.8 people per 1,000 aged 65+ are in local authority funded residential or nursing care placements.
- This is the highest rate in North Yorkshire and considerably above the county average (10.9).
- Clients with a PSR of 'Physical Support' make up 59.5% of those in residential & nursing placements, in line with the county average (59.0%).
- 2.5% of residential & nursing clients have a PSR of 'social support'. This is considerably higher than the county average (1.4%).

- 8% of residential & nursing places for ages 65+ cost in excess of £1,000 per week, substantially fewer than the county average (16%).
- 20% of residential placements are in excess of £1,000. This is below the county average (23%).
- 5% of nursing placements are in excess of £1,000, amongst the lowest levels in North Yorkshire, which average 13% across the county (LAA, Q4 2020/21).
- The average duration of residential / nursing services is 3.2 years during Q4 2020/21, in line with the county average (3.2 years).

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
