

Knipe Point





As you follow the footpath towards the coast you will begin to face Knipe Point, a rocky headland that is slowly eroding.

In 2008, Knipe Point received national media coverage when a large landslide led to the destruction of three homes!

Cornelian Trail instructions:



- ↑ 1. Start at the Dell and follow the green Discoveries On Your Doorstep waymarkers alongside the coast, until you reach Jackson's Lane.
- 2. Now follow the gold Discoveries On Your Doorstep waymarkers until you make your way back to the Dell.

Cornelian Bay





If you look out towards the sea you may be able to spot people looking for the semi-precious gemstone that gives Cornelian Bay its name.

The Cornelian is a clear, brownish-red stone made from a special mineral called chalcedony and the colour come from iron oxide impurities!

Smuggler's Coast





Cleveland Way runs parallel to Scarborough's coastline, which was famed for smuggling!

In the 1770's Scarborough's most famous smuggler was George 'Stoney' Fagg, with his ship the Kent! Contraband would be taken to the Old Harbour and traded at the Three Mariners Inn, which contained secret tunnels and hidden cupboards so the smugglers wouldn't get caught.
