DIVERSION ORDER 2023

This Order is made by The North Yorkshire Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the Authority that in the interests of the public it is expedient that the line of the path described in Paragraph 1 of this Order should be diverted.

This Order is also made under section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that The District of Hambleton (Outside the North York Moors National Park) Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in section 53(3)(a)(i) of the 1981 Act, namely, the diversion (as authorised by this Order) of a highway shown or required to be shown in the map and statement.

Great Langton Parish Council have been consulted as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

- The public right of way over the land situated at Moor House Farm, Great Langton, described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order shall be stopped up from the date on which the Authority certifies, in accordance with Section 119(3)(b) of the 1980 Act, that work to the new section of path, described in Part 2 of the Schedule, has been completed, and thereupon The District of Hambleton (Outside the North York Moors National Park) Definitive Map and Statement shall be modified by deleting from it that public right of way. Under no circumstances shall such certification be given before the date of confirmation of this Order.
- There shall from the date of the above mentioned certification be a public footpath over the land situated at Moor House Farm, Great Langton described in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this Order, and thereupon the The District of Hambleton (Outside the North York Moors National Park) Definitive Map shall be modified by adding that path to it.
- The District of Hambleton (Outside the North York Moors National Park) Definitive Statement shall be modified as described in Part 4 of the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.


