**(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2023**

NOTICE is hereby given that on 29 September 2023 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit motor vehicles from driving down both sides of Bell Close Harrogate, from its junction with Denison Avenue for its entirety, during school term only from Monday to Friday 8.15am – 9.00am and 3.00pm – 3.45pm for an experimental period of eighteen months., for an experimental period of eighteen months.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 20 October 2023, together with a map showing the road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be inspected at County Hall, Northallerton and at Harrogate Library, Victoria Avenue, Harrogate HG1 1EG during normal office hours from 12 October 2023 until 11 April 2024 and also viewed online at <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map> and <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders>.

The Council will be considering, in due course, whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within a period of six months from the coming into force of the Order, or if the Order is subsequently varied or modified, from the coming into operation of that variation or modification (whichever is the later), any person may object to the making of an Order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation.

Any person wishing to object to the indefinite continuation of the Order must state the grounds for their objection, in writing, addressed to Area 6 Highways Office Stump Cross Boroughbridge YO51 9HU or by email to [Area6.boroughbridge@northyorks.gov.uk](mailto:Area6.boroughbridge@northyorks.gov.uk) by 19 April 2024.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the above Experimental Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, they may, within six weeks of 29 September 2023 make application to the High Court for that purpose.
