(PROHIBITION OF HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLES) (VARIOUS ROADS, HARROGATE) ORDER 2025

NOTICE is hereby given that on 4 April 2025 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle (i.e. any goods vehicle which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes) from proceeding along any road or length of road specified in the following table, except for certain permitted purposes which include the conveyance of goods/access to or from premises situated on or adjacent to any of those roads, for the purposes of agriculture on land accessible from and only from any of those roads.
