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This Order is made by The North Yorkshire Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the Authority that in the interests of the owner of the land crossed by the Public Footpath described in Paragraph 1 of this Order it is expedient that the line of the Path should be diverted.

This Order is also made under Section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that The District of Hambleton (outside The North York Moors National Park) Definitive Map and Statement require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in Section 53(3)(a)(i) of the 1981 Act, namely, the diversion (as authorised by this Order) of a highway shown or required to be shown in the map and statement.

Mrs Louise Todd, Kirby Grange, Kirby Wiske, North Yorkshire, YO7 4EU has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public.

Kirby Wiske and Newsham with Breckenbrough Parish Council have been consulted as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The public right of way over the land situated at Kirby Grange, Kirby Wiske and Newsham with Breckenbrough and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up on the date on which the Authority certifies, in accordance with Section 119(3)(b) of the 1980 Act, that work to the new section of path, as described in Part 2 of the Schedule, has been completed to the reasonable satisfaction of the Authority and thereupon The District of Hambleton (outside The North York Moors National Park) Definitive Map shall be modified by deleting from it that public right of way. Under no circumstances shall such certification be given before the date of confirmation of this Order.
- 2. There shall from the date of the above mentioned certification be the Public Footpath over the land situated at Kirby Grange, Kirby Wiske and Newsham with Breckenbrough described in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this Order and thereupon The District of Hambleton (outside The North York Moors National Park) Definitive Map shall be modified by adding the Public Footpath to it.
- 2A. The District of Hambleton (outside The North York Moors National Park) Definitive Statement shall be modified as described in Part 4 of the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. The following works shall be carried out by the applicant in relation to the highway described in Part 2 of the Schedule: Stone surface from Point A to Point D, gap at Point D, pedestrian gate at Point F.

4. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.



If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
