

THE NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL
(40 MPH SPEED LIMIT)
(MENWITH HILL ROAD AND B6451, MENWITH HILL)
ORDER 2025

The North Yorkshire Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby order as follows:-

1. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on any length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.
2. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any Order or regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
3. This Order shall come into operation on 19 May 2025 and may be cited as "The North Yorkshire Council (40 mph Speed Limit) (Menwith Hill Road and B6451, Menwith Hill) Order 2025".

1.	Darley Carr (B6451/2/40)	From a point 110 metres North of the centreline of the Menwith Hill Road junction with the B6451, to a point 150 metres South of the Steeplebush Gate of RAF Menwith Hill on Menwith Hill Road towards Dangerous Corner.
2.	Menwith Hill Road (C252/1/40)	In its entirety from its junction with the B6451 to its junction with Stumps Lane (U3287/2/30).

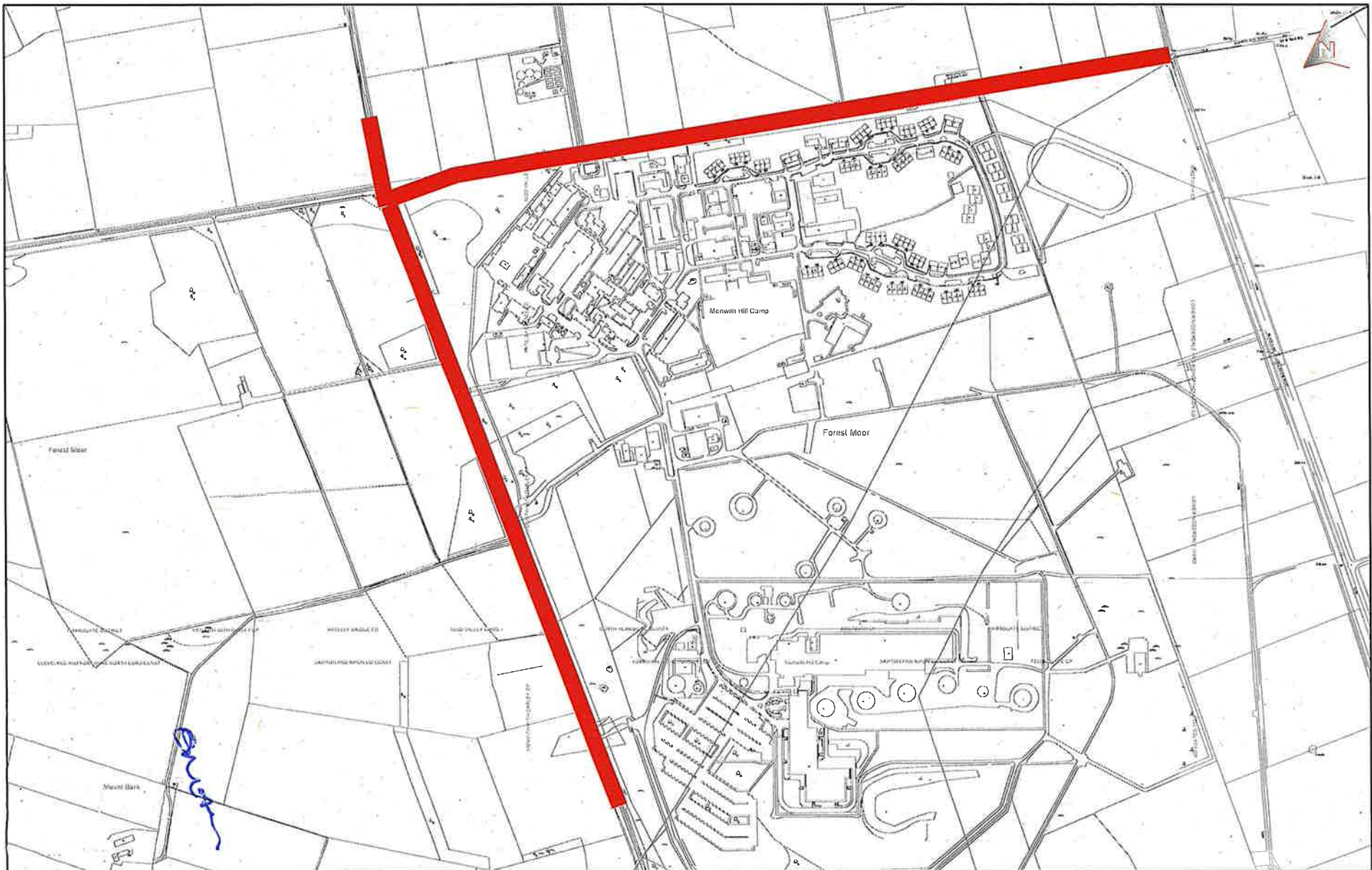
