

THE NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL

(30 MPH AND 40 MPH SPEED LIMITS) (VARIOUS ROADS, BORROWBY AND KNAVATON) ORDER 2025

NOTICE is hereby given that on 18 07 2025 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit any motor vehicle from travelling at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour on any length of road specified in table 1 below and at a speed in excess of 40 miles per hour on the length of road specified in table 2 below:.

30 MPH SPEED LIMIT

| 1. | U1832 (Road through Borrowby Village) | From its junction with Oaktree Bank for a distance of 25.6 metres measured along the centre line of the U1832 in a north westerly direction. |
| 2. | Oaktree Bank | From a point measured 78.5 metres in a north easterly direction of the junction of the U1832 and Oaktree Bank, to a point measured 75 metres in a north easterly direction from the centre line of the junction of Allerton Wath Road and Oaktree Bank. |

40 MPH SPEED LIMIT

| <u>Column 1</u> <u>Item</u> | <u>Column 2</u> <u>Road</u> | <u>Column 3</u> <u>Length</u> |

| 1. | Oaktree Bank | From a point measured 75 metres in a north easterly direction from the centre line of the junction of Allerton Wath Road and Oaktree Bank for a distance of 252 metres in a south westerly direction. |

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of 18 07 2025 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
