## (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING AND PROVISION OF PARKING) (BORRAGE LANE AND KING STREET, RIPON) (NO 44) ORDER 2025

**NOTICE** is hereby given that on 21 11 2025 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and under the Traffic Management Act 2004 ("the 2004 Act") by introducing the restrictions specified in the table below:-

## TABLE WAITING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES WITH EXEMPTIONS

Column 1 Item	Column 2 Road	Column 3 Length
1.	Borrage Lane, Ripon (U3047/2/70)	From where the Northern Kerb Line intersects with Low Skellgate to a point 29m away in a South Westerly Direction, following the Northern kerb Line
2.	Borrage Lane, Ripon (U3047/2/70)	From where the Southern Kerb Line intersects with Low Skellgate to a point 16m away in a South Westerly Direction, following the Southern kerb Line
3.	King Street, Ripon (C377/2/20)	From a point 9m North of the Centre Line of Waterside along the Eastern Kerb line of King Street for a distance of 63m in a Northerly Direction
4.	King Street, Ripon (C377/2/20)	From a point 9m North of the Centre Line of Waterside along the Western Kerb line of King Street for a distance of 59m in a Northerly Direction
