

Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Report 2025

October 2025

Introduction

The <u>Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Act 2015 (legislation.gov.uk)</u> (as amended by the Housing Act 2016 and the Levelling Up and Regeneration Act 2023 (LURA)) places a duty on Local Authorities to keep a register of individuals and associations of individuals who are seeking to acquire serviced plots of land in the authority's area for their own self-build and custom housebuilding.

The Local Authority must have regard to the register when carrying out its planning, housing, disposal of land of the authority and regeneration functions.

On the 1 April 2023 North Yorkshire Council (NYC) was formed and on the 6 February 2024 North Yorkshire Council introduced a new 2-part register, this register serves the new Council. Individuals and association of individuals interested in self-build or custom housebuilding are urged to join the register so their interest can feed into assessing the demand for self and custom housebuilding in North Yorkshire.

The new 2-Part North Yorkshire Register can be accessed via the <u>Self-build and custom housebuilding</u> <u>North Yorkshire Council</u>webpage where there is further information on national and local eligibility criteria.

- Part 1 of the register, applicants will need to meet local eligibility criteria and pay an admin fee. The local authority has a duty to provide sufficient plots to meet the identified demand on Part 1.
- Part 2 is for individuals or groups who either do not meet the eligibility criteria or, if a fee is required, choose not to pay the fee. This data will assist in the local authority in determining the overall demand for self-build plots in the authority area for the purposes of longer-term planning, housing, land disposal and regeneration but do not count towards demand for the purposes of the Act.

The proposed approach for setting up a single Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Register for North Yorkshire was set out in the Report to the Corporate Director of Community Development on the 11 October 2023 NYC Self Building and Customer Housebuilding Register.pdf (northyorks.gov.uk)

A <u>report of the Corporate Director of Community Development</u> seeking approval of a proposed criteria and fee for inclusion on Part 1 of the Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Register for North Yorkshire was considered on the 23 January 2024 where it was resolved that a new Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Register for North Yorkshire Council be introduced with local eligibility criteria and an administration fee. Part 1 applicants

For those who join the Part 1 Register the Council will send out an annual report of sites that have planning consent that may be available for development (small sites that are as yet undelivered).

This list is for information purposes only and does not constitute a formal recommendation by the Council; it is simply an enabling piece of work that if the applicant wishes to investigate further, they can do so.

Register for North Yorkshire Council

As required by the Act, and as set out above, the new North Yorkshire Council has introduced a North Yorkshire wide Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Register which can be accessed here <u>Self-build and custom housebuilding | North Yorkshire Council</u>, the data collected will feed into planning, housing, the disposal of land of the authority and regeneration.

Other data sources

The guidance set out in the National Planning Policy Guidance Note (NPPG) on Self-build and Custom Housebuilding <a href="https://www.gov.uk/guidance/self-build-and-custom-housebuildingrecommends when assessing local housing need that the type and tenure of housing needed for different groups should be assessed including people who wish to self-build or custom-build their own home.

The Council commissioned Iceni Projects Limited to prepare a Housing and Economic Needs Assessment (HEDNA). In addition to the data held on the Council's registers, inline with the guidance in the NPPG, secondary data sources where used to assess demand. The Council commissioned a report from Custom Build Housing, who assess the data on the national Right to Build Register (RTBR), this report along with data held by the National Custom and Self-Build Association (NaCSBA) and the data on the North Yorkshire Register and legacy Registers fed into the demand data for the HEDNA.

Custom Build Housing Report

The Custom Build Housing Report looks at the number of people subscribed to the RTBR who are currently registered as actively looking to custom or self-build their own homes within the North Yorkshire Council area (the district). The data is broken down to cover North Yorkshire Council, North York Moors National Park and Yorkshire Dales National Park. The National Parks hold their own Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Registers.

The assessment identified 729 potential custom and self-builders on the RTBR would are presently looking for a plot to build their own home within the North Yorkshire Plan area. The buyer profile indicates that 94% are seeking a self-build project, with 6% looking for custom-build with the majority wanting a four-bedroom or three bedroom dwelling.

What we don't know is what percentage of those registered on the Right to Build Register are also registered on the North Yorkshire Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Register or one of the legacy registers.

NaCSBA data

The YouGov survey carried out in October 2020 on behalf of NaCSBA found that 1 in 3 people (32%) are interested in building their own home at some point in the future, including 12% who said they were very interested.

We can also draw on NaCSBA data to better understand the level of demand for serviced plots in North Yorkshire in relative terms. The association published an analysis with supporting maps and commentary titled "Mapping the Right to Build" in 2020.

This document includes an output on the demand for serviced plots as a proportion of the total population relative to all other local authorities across England (see Figure below).

This was based on the Legacy Authorities and the National Park and shows that:

Legacy Authority areas

- Craven 58 Plots per 100,000
- Hambleton 188 Plots per 100,000
- Harrogate 272 Plots per 100,000
- Richmondshire 101 Plots per 100,000
- Ryedale 99 Plots per 100,000
- Scarborough 30 Plots per 100,000.
- Selby 50 Plots per 100,000

National Parks

- North York Moor National Park 166 Plots per 100,000
- Yorkshire Dales National Park 42 Plots per 100,000

Based on the legacy authority and national park population in 2021 this would equate to a need for around 877 units. Although there is a degree of double counting between the National Parks and the Legacy Authorities. The legacy authorities alone would generate a need for 829 dwellings.

Demand

The HEDNA concludes that looking at the data from the Custom House Building Report that this would suggest the previous registers do not underestimate the need and that when considering the NaCSBA data, that "

The North Yorkshire Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Register and secondary data sources all indicate there is demand for self-build and custom-build plots across North Yorkshire.

Plots permissioned BP1 - BP9

Monitoring of plots permissioned

Annual monitoring of plots permissioned in a base period has always been carried out in line with the legislation, and the guidance set out in the NPPG, at the time.

The Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Act as amended by the Levelling Up and Regeneration Act 2023 amended the wording of the Act including Section 2A 'Duty to grant planning permission etc.' coming into effect in January 2024. The amendments removed the reference to 'suitable development permission' and requires demand not met within 3 base periods is rolled over to the next base period.

At (5A) the Act refers to Regulations which may make provision specifying descriptions of planning permissions or permissions in principle that are, or are not, to be treated as development permission for the carrying out of self-build and custom housebuilding. These Regulations are awaited.

The monitoring of Base Period 9 was carried out in accordance with the updated Act which at Section 2A 'Duty to grant planning permission etc.' (2) reads;

An authority to which section applied must give development permission for the carrying out self-build and custom housebuilding on enough serviced plots of land to meet the demand for self-build an custom housebuilding int he authority's area in respect of each base period.

Meeting the duty

Duty under the Act

Under the Act the Local Authority has a duty to give development permission in respect of enough serviced plots of land to meet the demand for self-build and custom housebuilding in an authority's area in respect of each base period. The latest published position is set out in this report.

Monitoring of plots permissioned has been carried out inline with the Act and guidance published and set out at the time. Monitoring for Base Period 9 has been carried out in accordance with the Act as amended by the LURA 2023.

The Self-build and Custom Housebuilding Act (as amended) refers to Regulations which may make provision specifying descriptions of planning permissions or permissions in principle that are, or are not, to be treated as development permission for the carrying out of self-build and custom housebuilding.

These Regulations are awaited.

Housing and Economic Needs Assessment (HEDNA) May 2025

As set out above, the North Yorkshire Housing and Economic Needs Assessment, May 2025 looked at the demand on the legacy Registers, the demand on the North Yorkshire Council register and also looked at secondary sources including data from NaCSBA (National Custom and Self-Build Association) and data within the commissioned Custom Build Homes report.

These data sources all indicate there is demand for self-build and custom housebuilding plots across North Yorkshire. This data will feed in the plan-making process to encourage delivery, promote and boost supply of self-build and custom housebuilding plots across North Yorkshire.

Craven Local Plan Area

Craven planning policy | North Yorkshire Council The self-build register was introduced in 2016.

Hambleton Local Plan Area

<u>Hambleton planning policy | North Yorkshire Council</u>The self-build register was introduced in 2016.

The Hambleton Local Plan, adopted in February 2022, contains policy HG2: Delivering the Right Type of Homes. In criterion b, the policy sets out that the Council will work with developers, registered providers, landowners and relevant individuals or groups to address identified local demand for self and custom build homes as identified in the Hambleton Self and Custom Build Register. In addition, the Council's approach to windfall housing developed set out in policy HG5: Windfall Housing Development, is considered to provide opportunities for self and custom build homes.

Harrogate District Local Plan Area

<u>Harrogate planning policy | North Yorkshire Council</u>The self-build register was introduced in 2016.

The Harrogate District Local Plan Policy HS3 Self and Custom Housebuilding requires 5% of dwelling plots on strategic sites of 500 dwellings or more to be for sale to self-builders. <u>Local Plan 2014-2035 - Housing, Transport and Infrastructure and Climate Change - Chapters 5, 6 and 7 (northyorks.gov. uk)</u>There are a number of sites which will deliver self-build plots under Policy HS3, these are set out below.

The justification to the policy expects that a proportion of self-build will come forward on small sites and single plots on infill sites and sites on the edges of settlements. The Council acknowledge there is a shortfall in meeting the duty in the Harrogate District plan area and thus give substantial weight in the planning balance to the delivery of self-build plots.

However, it is important to note it is essential that the Harrogate District Local Plan is read as a whole, there may be other policies in the plan that indicate otherwise; all proposals must comply with all relevant policies.

If you have a site, the Council offer a pre-application advice service which aims to take some uncertainty out of the planning process. Please note as set out in the <u>Self-build and custom housebuilding - GOV.</u> <u>UK (www.gov.uk)</u>there is no duty on a relevant authority to permission land which specifically meets the requirements expressed by those on the register.
