

THE NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL
(HAMBLETON GROVE, KNARESBOROUGH) (PROHIBITION OF HEAVY COMMERCIAL
VEHICLES) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2026

(New order made due to administration error in the previous order made on 23 January 2026)

NOTICE is hereby given that on 13 02 2026 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle from proceeding in either direction along those lengths of road specified in columns 2 and 3 set out in the Schedule to this Order between 7.00am and 9.30am and between 3.00pm and 4.30pm for an experimental period of eighteen months.

A copy of the Order, which comes into force on 06 03 2026, together with a map showing the road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be inspected at County Hall, Northallerton and at Knaresborough Library, Jockey Lane, Knaresborough HG5 0HB during normal office hours from 26 02 2026 until 06 09 2026 and also viewed online at www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map or www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders.

The Council will be considering, in due course, whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within a period of six months from the coming into force of the Order, or if the Order is subsequently varied or modified, from the coming into operation of that variation or modification (whichever is the later), any person may object to the making of an Order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation.

Any person wishing to object to the indefinite continuation of the Order must state the grounds for their objection, in writing, addressed to Area 6 Boroughbridge Highways Office, Stump Cross, Boroughbridge, York YO51 9HU or by email to Area6.Boroughbridge@northyorks.gov.uk or via the website link above. by 06 09 2026.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the above Experimental Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, they may, within six weeks of 13 02 2026 make application to the High Court for that purpose.
