**(DERESTRICTION SPEED LIMIT)**  
**(GRASSINGTON ROAD ROUNDABOUT, SKIPTON)**  
**ORDER 2026**

**NOTICE** is hereby given that on 30 January 2026 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 82(2), 83(2) and 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to remove the 30 mph speed limit (restricted road status) imposed on the following roads at Skipton due to the presence of street lighting – the Order also revokes in its entirety “The Council of the County of North Yorkshire (Derestriction) (Grassington Road Roundabout) Order 1986”:-

1.	A65 Grassington Road Roundabout	The roundabout circulatory carriageway in its entirety.
2.	A65 Stirton Roundabout to Grassington Road Roundabout	From its junction with the Grassington Road Roundabout in a westerly direction for 147 metres.
3.	B6265 Grassington Road	From its junction with the Grassington Road Roundabout in a northerly direction for 94 metres.
4.	A65 Grassington Road Roundabout to Cross Bank	From its junction with the Grassington Road Roundabout in a easterly direction for 66 metres.
5.	B6265 Grassington Road	From its junction with the Grassington Road Roundabout in a south easterly direction for 70 metres.
6.	Raikes Road	From its junction with the Grassington Road Roundabout in a south westerly direction for 84 metres.

A copy of the Order, which comes into force on 09 February 2026, together with a map showing the roads affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton and at Skipton Library, High Street, Skipton BD23 1JX during normal office hours from 05 February 2026 until 13 March 2026 and also viewed online at [www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map](http://www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map) or [www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders](http://www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders).

If you wish to question the validity of the above Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of 30 January 2026 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
