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A1. Introduction

A1.1 This is a standalone appendix to the North Yorkshire Housing and Economic Development Needs Assessment (HEDNA). The purpose of this appendix is to detail the findings of our site assessments which took place over a concentrated period in late September and early October.

A1.2 The site assessments provide each site with a recommendation: Retain (if protected as an existing employment site within existing policy); Protect (if no current policy applies); or Release. Some recommendations include a recommended amendment to the boundary to reflect the growth of the employment site or non-employment uses that should be excluded from the site.

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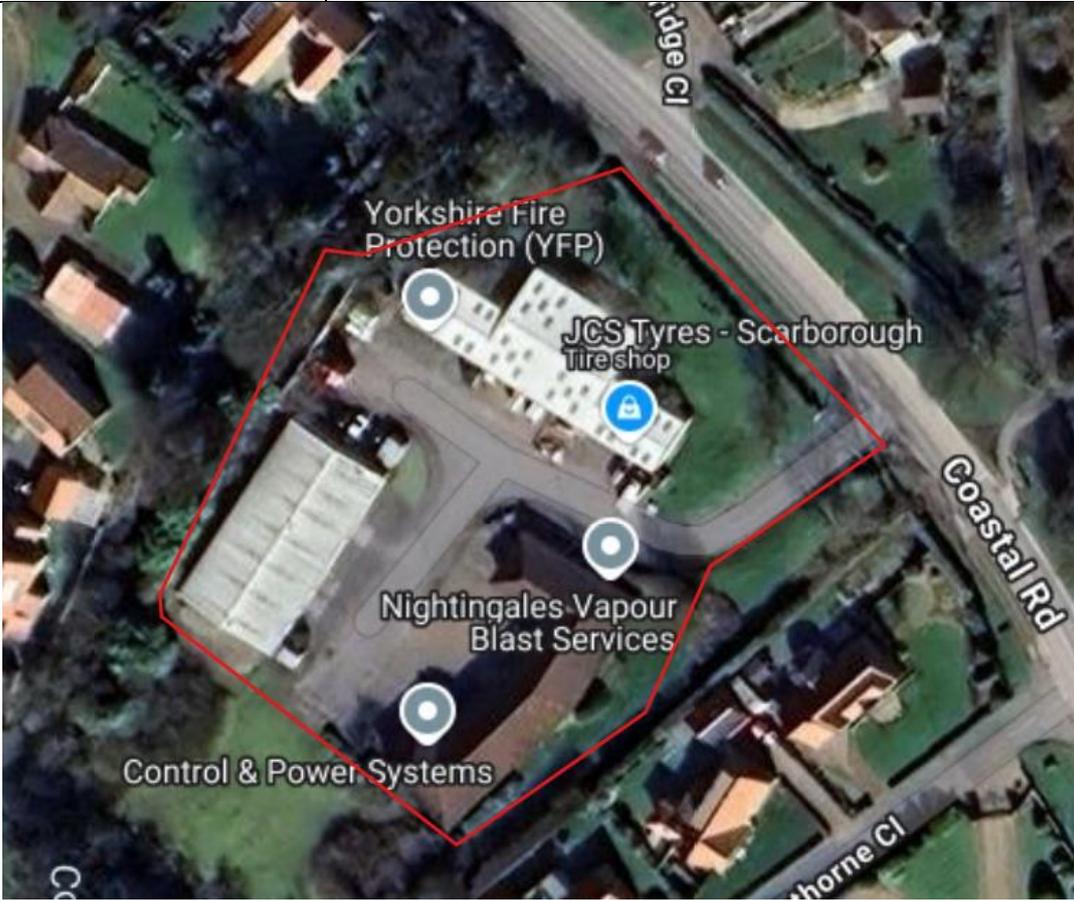
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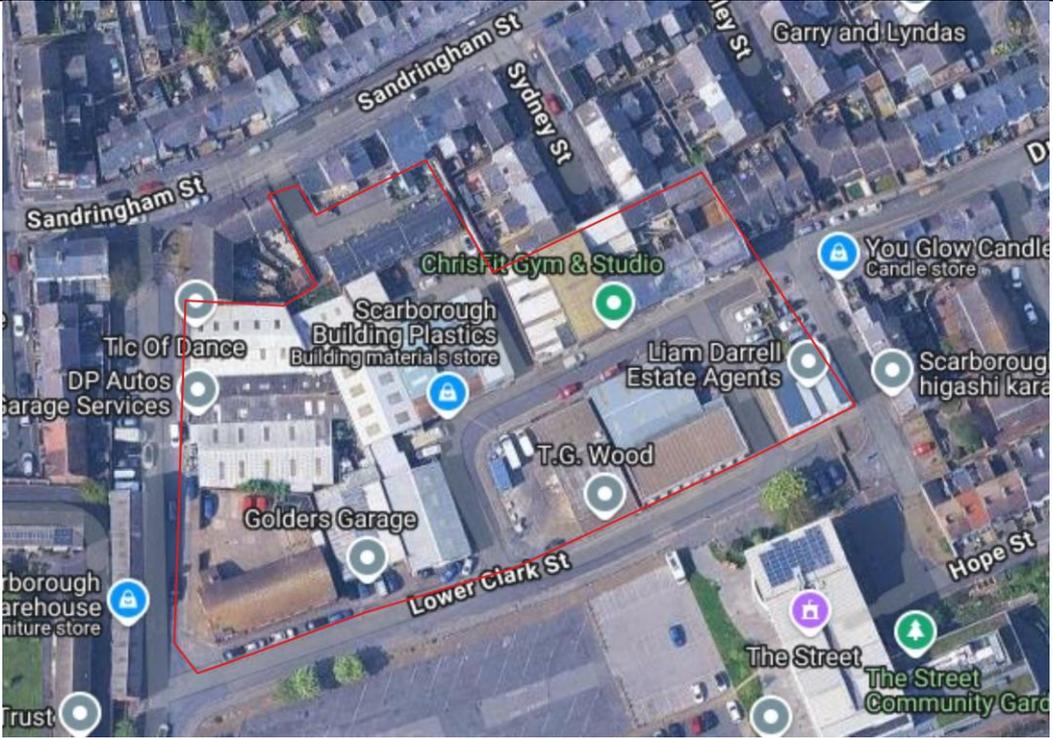
