

THE NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL
(20 AND 30 MPH SPEED LIMITS)
(VARIOUS ROADS, MARKINGTON) ORDER 2026

NOTICE is hereby given that The North Yorkshire Council proposes to make an Order under Sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which will be to prohibit any motor vehicle from travelling:

At a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour on any length of road specified in Table 1 below:

TABLE 1 – 20MPH

<u>Column 1 Item</u>	<u>Column 2 Road</u>	<u>Column 3 Length</u>
1.	Back Lane, Markington	From its junction with High Street in a south easterly then south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 130 metres
2.	Dam Lane, Markington	From its junction with Hincks Hall Lane in a westerly direction for 19 metres.
3.	High Street, Markington	From its junction with Hincks Hall Lane in a north easterly direction for 387 metres.
4.	Kingwood, Markington	For its entire length.
5.	Little Croft	For its entire length
6.	Westerns Lane, Markington	From its junction with High Street in a northerly direction for 166 metres.

At a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour on any length of road specified in Table 2 below:

TABLE 2 – 30MPH

<u>Column 1 Item</u>	<u>Column 2 Road</u>	<u>Column 3 Length</u>
1.	High Street, Markington	From a point approximately 387 metres north east of its junction with Hincks Hall Lane to its junction with the C375 and C263.
2.	C263 Markington	From its junction with High Street and the C375 in a north easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1015 metres
3.	C375 Markington	From its junction with High Street and the C263 in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 545 metres.
4.	Beechwood Close, Markington	For its entire length.
