

Settlement Hierarchy Background Paper

North Yorkshire Local Plan: our first conversation



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1 Introduction

What is a settlement hierarchy?

- 1.1 A settlement hierarchy involves identifying and grouping together settlements that perform similar roles. It identifies the functions of settlements in terms of their housing, economic and commercial offers, as well as the scale of services and facilities already present within settlements. The settlement hierarchy will help to inform the spatial strategy for the local plan.
- 1.2 It is the role of the paper to group the settlements in a hierarchy by their relative sustainability in terms of available services and infrastructure, the spatial strategy will consider their ability to accommodate development.
- 1.3 While this hierarchy is not itself a strategy for distributing development across the respective tiers, settlements with the higher tiers will generally be better able to accommodate additional development. Decisions around the distribution are to be made through the plan-making process, and potential growth options are presented in the main 'our first conversation' document. The classification of settlements is based on their current role, services and facilities, and would not limit decisions regarding their future role as influenced by growth strategy options.

Why produce a new settlement hierarchy?

- 1.4 Settlements may have lost or gained services and infrastructure since they were placed in the settlement hierarchies of the former districts, and these will need to be reviewed.
- 1.5 The importance of certain types of services and infrastructure has shifted since the Covid 19 pandemic and has resulted in an emphasis on a highly connected, digitised world of hybrid working and technological change; it could now be argued that the availability of high-speed broadband is more important than a regular bus service. This is largely due to the nature of commuting for employment changing, with the 2020 Covid 19 pandemic accelerating a shift to home working. This potentially reduces the importance of the proximity of populations to places of employment and increases the importance of communication services such as high-speed broadband.
- 1.6 The population of the UK continues to grow, in turn the population of settlements has changed, with a degree of growth for almost all settlements within the North Yorkshire authority area. However, some settlements (for a variety of factors) have grown more than others and it will need to be assessed, based on a settlements' population relative to others in its tier of the hierarchy, whether this changes a settlement's position in the hierarchy.

Former settlement hierarchies

- 1.7 Of the eight former local authorities that, together, make up the North Yorkshire Local Plan area, six have produced a settlement hierarchy that forms part of their adopted development plans. At different points in time, each of the six former districts produced an audit of their respective settlements' services in order to help inform their spatial approach to the distribution of development. Adoption dates of these development plans range from 2005 to as recent as 2022. The North Yorkshire Local Plan will replace the existing local plans for the former district authority areas, including their settlement hierarchies.

National planning policy and guidance

- 1.8 The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) places many plan-making requirements on local planning authorities. Although the creation of a settlement hierarchy is not something which is explicitly required by the NPPF, it is an effective policy tool to deliver on many of the NPPF's expectations.

- 1.9** The (selected) paragraphs below refer to planning issues which can be addressed by an effective settlement hierarchy. Distilled down, the NPPF requires a local plan to allocate growth sustainably; that is an issue which is at the heart of the settlement hierarchy.
- 1.10** Paragraph 20: Strategic policies should set out an overall strategy for the pattern, scale and design quality of places and make sufficient provision for:
- Homes (including affordable housing), employment, retail, leisure and other commercial development
 - Infrastructure
 - Community facilities
 - Conservation and enhancement of the natural, built and historic environment, including landscapes
- 1.11** Paragraph 77: The supply of large numbers of new homes can often be best achieved through planning for larger scale development, such as new settlements or significant extensions to existing villages and towns, provided they are well located and designed and supported by the necessary infrastructure and facilities... Strategic policy-making authorities should identify suitable locations for such development where this can help to meet identified needs in a sustainable way. Authorities should:
- consider the opportunities presented by existing or planned investment in infrastructure, the area's economic potential and the scope for net environmental gains;
 - ensure that their size and location will support a sustainable community, with sufficient access to services and employment opportunities within the development itself or in larger towns to which there is good access.
- 1.12** Paragraph 83: To promote sustainable development in rural areas, housing should be located where it will enhance or maintain the vitality of rural communities. Planning policies should identify opportunities for villages to grow and thrive, especially where this will support local services. Where there are groups of smaller settlements, development in one village may support services in a village nearby.
- 1.13** Paragraph 84: Planning policies... should avoid the development of isolated homes in the countryside (with limited exceptions).
- 1.14** Paragraph 87: Planning policies and decisions should recognize and address the specific locational requirements of different sectors. This includes making provision for: Clusters or networks of knowledge and data-driven, creative or high technology industries;
- 1.15** Paragraph 96: Planning policies... should... enable and support healthy lifestyles, especially where this would address identified local health and well-being needs – for example through the provision of safe and accessible green infrastructure, sports facilities, local shops, access to healthier food, allotments...
- 1.16** Paragraph 98: To provide the social, recreational and cultural facilities and services the community needs, planning policies... should...
- plan positively for the provision and use of shared spaces, community facilities and other local services to enhance the sustainability of communities
 - guard against the unnecessary loss of valued facilities and services
 - ensure that established shops, facilities and services are able to develop and modernise, and are retained for the benefit of the community
 - ensure an integrated approach to considering the location of housing, economic uses and community facilities and services.
- 1.17** Paragraph 109: Transport issues should be considered... so that:
- opportunities from existing or proposed transport infrastructure... are realized
 - opportunities to promote walking, cycling and public transport are... pursued

- 1.18** Paragraph 110: Significant development should be focused on locations which are or can be made sustainable, through limiting the need to travel and offering a genuine choice of transport modes.

Profile of the council area

- 1.19** In order to write the settlement hierarchy, the profile of the Council area needs to be closely considered.
- 1.20** North Yorkshire has a diverse and dispersed population of an estimated 615,400 people across a geographical area of over 8,000 square kilometres or 3,090 square miles, making it the largest county in England. The population density is just 77 people per square kilometre, which is very low when compared with the national average of 434. The demographic of the area is older than the national average, with 24.5% of the populace aged 0-24, compared to 29.2% nationally and 25% aged 65+, compared to 18.4% nationally.
- 1.21** Large parts of the county sit within two National Parks and these have their own planning regulations outside the remit of North Yorkshire Council, there are also three National Landscapes in the County; The Forest of Bowland, Nidderdale and Howardian Hills.
- 1.22** The North Yorkshire economy is defined by over 32,000 small and medium enterprises, which form 99% of all businesses locally. The average household income is £41,628, which is below the national average of £43,996.
- 1.23** In terms of transportation, there are good north-south links in the centre of the County, due to the A1 and east coast mainline, however due to its rural nature and topography, transport connectivity is difficult in much of the rest of the County.

2 Methodology

Deciding what makes a settlement sustainable

2.1 When choosing a hierarchy there are multiple criteria which can be used to determine how sustainable a settlement is and therefore where in the hierarchy it is placed. Each of these criteria will be examined in turn and we will describe how they will be used to formulate the settlement hierarchy.

Population

2.2 The number of people that already live in a settlement is a major factor in deciding their place in the hierarchy, higher populations demand and attract greater types and amounts of employment and services, than smaller ones. The same is true of transport infrastructure and public space. Settlements with bigger populations have a greater capacity to absorb development than smaller settlements, whose character, infrastructure and services may be overwhelmed by receiving the same amount of development as a larger settlement.

Method for calculating settlement population

2.3 The Office of National Statistics (ONS) provides annual estimates of population, these are called “the mid-year estimates”. These are produced on standard statistical areas from the national scale to a very local level. The lowest geographical unit is called a Lower Super Output area or LSOA. These rarely relate well to actual settlement boundaries on the ground. Using LSOA’s will give an inflated estimate of the settlement’s population as they include a rural hinterland or other small settlements.

2.4 The method used for this exercise attempts to give an actual accurate settlement population. There are six steps needed to do this:

1. First using data from ONS’s latest mid- year estimate at LSOA level, a total population is obtained.
2. Using a property list, the total number of dwellings is summed up for each LSOA.
3. By dividing the population by the number of dwellings, we can get an average number of people per dwelling.
4. The average number of people per dwelling is added to each property.
5. Using a map an area is defined as the built-up area of each settlement.
6. Using a digital mapping system, the population for each dwelling within the settlement is summed to derive the total settlement population.

Dwelling numbers

2.5 The number of residential properties in North Yorkshire totals around 307,000 (as of the 1st of April 2024) has also been considered, as this is another strong indicator of the size of a settlement and its ability to attract and sustain services. The number of residential properties often correlates with the population size, however settlements with larger family homes will have more residents per house than settlements with a larger proportion of flats and smaller terraced houses and bungalows.

Services

2.6 A population’s ability to access services such as shopping, health and education is important for maintaining their quality of life. Long distance travel to access these services is undesirable because this inevitably involves increased car use and pollution, therefore services within the settlement will be considered when judging its sustainability.

2.7 The frequency of use of services has a strong link to the sustainability of a settlement, as settlements with services that are used frequently are scored higher than settlements with services that are used less frequently. Therefore, the council has used a method of scoring services based on their frequency, which can be seen below;

- Frequent: A service used daily or at least weekly (3 points).
- Infrequent: A service used weekly or at least monthly (2 points).
- Rare: A service used monthly, bi-monthly or at least annually (1 point).

2.8 The maximum a settlement can score is 36 points.

Linking of settlements

2.9 Certain settlements have a close relationship to each other in terms of their proximity and the way residents of each settlement will use services from the other. Some settlements may have merged into each other over time whereas others are physically separate but have good linkages between them.

2.10 In planning terms, it then makes sense to link them together in the hierarchy because they essentially function as a single settlement. Linked settlements have their populations and services combined in the hierarchy.

2.11 Several settlements have been linked together in the North Yorkshire settlement hierarchy. The types of settlements that are linked are mostly villages which are closely related to each other, but also the larger towns and settlements which have merged with the urban area or are in close proximity to and share their services. Table 2 below shows the conclusive list of linked settlements and gives the reasons for linking them.

Barlby and Osgodby	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Villages are very closely situated but physically separated for a short distance by the A19, but there is a pedestrian footbridge over this road. • Residents share key services such as pubs and schools.
Beadlam and Nawton	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The two settlements have fully coalesced with no obvious distinction, and they share all the services.
Bedale / Aiskew	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physically separated a short distance by a railway line and the Bedale Beck, but due to their close proximity, residents share services.

Byram and Brotherton	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Villages very closely situated but physically separated for a short distance by the A1246, there is a pedestrian walkway over this. • Residents share key services such as pubs and schools.
Cross Hills/Glusburn and Sutton in Craven	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cross Hills and Glusburn are completely contiguous with each other. • Sutton in Craven lies to the south of Cross Hills/Glusburn and is separated from it by a field. • Sutton in Craven has a range of its own key services and facilities, such as a primary school, small shop, pubs, outdoor sports facilities, large multi-purpose park etc. • Residents in these three villages share a wide array of key services and facilities (secondary school, healthcare facilities, convenience shopping, employment).
East Ayton and West Ayton	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two settlements that have coalesced. • Many of the main services of each are shared and lie within the central section of the combined settlements (so the western end of East Ayton, and vice versa).

Malton, Old Malton and Norton	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Malton and Norton directly neighbour each other and are separated only by the River Derwent, though Malton is the older of the two towns. The rural village of Old Malton is older still and though it remains physically separated to the north and east of Malton, the gap has narrowed in recent years. • Malton, Norton and Old Norton function as a single settlement, with services shared between them, such as the train station in Norton and the hospital in Malton.
Monk Fryston and Hillam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Villages are very closely situated and separated only by a 50-metre field. • Residents share key services such as the pub and school.
Northallerton / Romanby	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physically merged together. • Residents share key services such as the pub and school.

Selby Urban Area (Selby/Northern Brayton/Barlby Bridge)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It consists of the built area of the parish of Selby as well as the north-eastern part of the parish of Brayton along Doncaster Road and the southwestern part of the parish of Barlby up to the Greencore Factory. • The combined parts of these parishes function as a single settlement. The services in this area such as schools, health centres and shops are shared closely by the residents. • The urban form between the parishes of Selby and Brayton is continuous in the Doncaster Road area until south of Baffam Lane. Thirsk / Sowerby	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The two settlements have fully coalesced with no obvious distinction. • They share services.
Whitby and Ruswarp	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ruswarp is attached to the larger settlement of Whitby by Ruswarp Lane. • Residents of Ruswarp will use the services in the settlement of Whitby.

3 Structure of the settlement hierarchy

- 3.1** A settlement's place in the hierarchy has been informed by all the factors described in the methodology section and a full analysis of the sustainability of each settlement can be seen in B: Settlements by hierarchy tier.
- 3.2** This section of the paper explains why settlements have been ranked and grouped into these tiers and explains any exceptions to this. It is important to note that settlements have been ranked into categories on a range of the sustainability factors mentioned above and not just one such as population size.
- 3.3** Settlements in the North Yorkshire settlement hierarchy have been grouped and ranked into 5 tiers, this was done because, in terms of populations and services, certain groups of settlements had broad things in common, which is explained further below. Some exceptions have been made based on the individual circumstances of certain settlements and the reasons for these exceptions are explained in each tier. All other settlements are classed as being in the countryside.

Major Town

- 3.4** The population and dwelling numbers show two towns in North Yorkshire that are significantly larger than any other settlements, these being Harrogate and Scarborough. Harrogate is the largest settlement in North Yorkshire, with over 73,000 residents and over 36,000 dwellings. The Scarborough Urban Area is the second largest settlement, with over 60,000 residents and over 32,000 dwellings.
- 3.5** These two settlements are therefore designated Major Towns in the hierarchy, this is because they also have a strong regional significance in terms of their housing market, employment opportunities, service availability and tourism. This is reflected in the settlements scoring the maximum of 36 for service provision in this paper's methodology.

Key Service Centre

- 3.6** There are 9 settlements in North Yorkshire classed as Key Service Centres, these have populations of between 12,000 to 20,000 and 5,000 to 9,000 dwellings. These settlements all score the maximum of 36 for service provision.

Local Service Centre

- 3.7** There are 14 settlements in North Yorkshire classed as Local Service Centres. They have between 3,300 to 9,500 residents and 1,700 and 4,500 dwellings and have a service score provision of 22 and 36.

Neighbourhood Service Centre

- 3.8** There are 32 settlements in the hierarchy classed as Neighbourhood Service Centres, most of these settlements have populations of between 1,500 and 3,100, and 700 to 1,500 dwellings. They have a service score range of 13 to 36. Additionally, we have included well served settlements with at least a score of 25 and a minimum population of circa 1000.
- 3.9** The joint settlement of Byram and Brotherton is classified as a Neighbourhood Service Centre rather than a Local Service Centre, even though they jointly have a population of over 3,300 because they have a lower service score of 15.

Small Settlement


3.10 120 settlements in the hierarchy are classed as Small Settlements, these have populations of between 300 to 1,500, and 80 to 1,100 dwellings. They have a service score range of 3 to 36.

Countryside

3.11 All settlements with populations lower than 300 are classed as being in the countryside. There are 362 such settlements in the hierarchy, with populations that range from 6 to 300 people.
