(20 MPH AND 30 MPH SPEED LIMITS)
(VARIOUS ROADS, HUNTON) ORDER 2026

NOTICE is hereby given that on 17th April 2026 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which will be to prohibit any motor vehicle from travelling at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour on any length of road in Hunton specified in table 1 below and prohibit any motor vehicle from travelling at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour on any length of road in Hunton specified in table 2 below :-

Table 1 – Various Roads, Hunton

<u>Column 1</u> <u>Item</u>	<u>Column 2</u> <u>Road</u>	<u>Column 3</u> <u>Length</u>
1.	Church Bank/South View/Leyburn Road	From a point 14 metres north-east of its junction with Jack Lane in a south-westerly direction to a point 210 metres west of its junction with Wild Hill Lane.
2.	Bedale Road	From its junction with Leyburn Road/South View in a south-easterly direction for 364 metres.
3.	Greenacres	For its entire length.
4.	Ratten Row	For its entire length.
5.	Wild Hill Lane	From its junction with Leyburn Road, in a southerly direction for a distance of 270 metres
6.	Wyville Close	For its entire length.

Table 2 – Various Roads, Hunton

<u>Column 1</u> <u>Item</u>	<u>Column 2</u> <u>Road</u>	<u>Column 3</u> <u>Length</u>
1.	Hunton Road	From its junction with Leyburn Road in a westerly direction for 41 metres
2.	Leyburn Road	From a point 210 metres west of its junction with Wild Hill Lane in a westerly direction to a point 94 metres south west of its junction with Hunton Road

A copy of the Order, which comes into force on 27th April 2026, may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton and at Parish Notice Board in Hunton during normal office hours from 24th April 2026 until 29th May 2026 and also viewed online at www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map or www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of 17th April 2026 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
