(PROHIBITION OF HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLES) (VARIOUS ROADS, CRIDLING STUBBS AND KELLINGLY) ORDER 2026

NOTICE is hereby given that on Friday, 14 August 2026 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1), 2(2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle (i.e. any goods vehicle which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes) from proceeding along any road or length of road specified in the following table, except for certain permitted purposes which include the conveyance of goods/access to or from premises situated on or adjacent to any of those roads, for the purposes of agriculture on land accessible from and only from any of those roads or for the garaging, servicing or repairing of a vehicle at premises accessible from and only from any of those roads.

SCHEDULE

ROAD(S) IN THE VILLAGE/PARISHES OF VARIOUS ROADS, CRIDLING STUBBS AND KELLINGLY

Beal Lane, Cridling Stubbs (C3366/1/20) and Sudforth Lane Kellingly (C336/1/60&C336/1/40)

PROHIBITION OF HEAVY COMMERCIAL VEHICLES EXCEEDING 7.5T (EXCEPT FOR LOADING AND UNLOADING)

Location	Road	From	To	Nature of Restriction
Cridling Stubbs	Beal Lane	The junction with Cobcroft Lane	Northerly for 916.25 metres	7.5t weight restriction
Kellingly	Sudforth Lane	916.25 metres north from the junction with Cobcroft Lane	Northerly for 1408.22 metres	7.5 weight restriction

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of Friday, 14th August 2026 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
