(PARKING AND WAITING) (NO 71) ORDER 2026

NOTICE is hereby given that on 21 August 2026 The North Yorkshire Council made an Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32(1) and 35(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and under the Traffic Management Act 2004, the effect of which is to introduce the following restrictions specified in the Schedules below:-
