

## ADMISSIONS POLICY FOR TRANSFER FROM YEAR 11 AND YEAR 12 ENTRY FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2016/17

### Transfer from Year 11

Existing Year 11 students at St Aidan's Church of England High School or St John Fisher Catholic High School wishing to enter into St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form will be able to do so providing they meet the minimum entry qualifications as detailed in the 2016/17 Sixth Form Prospectus.

### Year 12 entry

Students attending other schools in Year 11 are able to apply for places in Year 12 at the Associated Sixth Form. All applicants wishing to join St Aidan's or St John Fisher for the first time in Year 12 are subject to the same entry qualifications as those set out below for existing students.

The Governing Body of St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form will, under section 324 of the Education Act 1996, admit to the Associated Sixth Form a young person with an Education, Health and Care Plan that names St Aidan's Church of England High School or St John Fisher Catholic High School. This is not an oversubscription criterion. This relates only to young people who have undergone statutory assessment and for whom a final Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) has been issued and which has taken account of the Year 12 entry requirements.

**If, following the admission of young people where either St Aidan's Church of England High School or St John Fisher Catholic High School is named in the Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), the number of applications to join the school for the first time exceeds the published admission number of 750 and further places cannot be provided, then the following oversubscription criteria will apply:**

<p><b>Priority Group 1:</b></p> <p>Young people in Public Care for whom an application has been submitted.</p>	<p><i>This applies to all looked-after young people, including those who are in the care of another local authority.</i></p>
<p><b>Priority Group 2 :</b></p> <p>Young people who have a sibling on St Aidan's Church of England High School or St John Fisher Catholic High School roll in September 2015.</p>	<p><i>Sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent / carer's partner where the child for whom the school place is sought is living in the same family unit at the same address as that sibling.</i></p>
<p><b>Priority Group 3 :</b></p> <p>All other young people.</p>	

*Young people in higher numbered priority groups will be offered places ahead of those in lower numbered priority groups.*

#### *Tie break:*

*If there are not enough places for all the young people in one of these priority groups, we will give priority to those living nearest to St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form.*

*Distance measurements are based on the nearest walked route from the applicant's home address to St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form. We measure from a fixed point within the dwelling, as identified by Ordnance Survey, to the nearest St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form entrance using an electronic mapping system.*

### **Additional Notes:**

- Students in Year 11 at either St Aidan's Church of England High School or St John Fisher Catholic High School will only be admitted to the Associated Sixth Form if in the judgment of the Senior Leadership Team, a suitable course is available that is appropriate to their needs.
- Students are only able to study in the Associated Sixth Form if they are on full time courses ie 4 AS Levels, 3 A Levels or equivalent
- Entrance into the Sixth Form is subject to the regulations regarding residency status and eligibility for study in UK schools Sixth Form courses that apply at the time.

### **Progression from Year 12 to Year 13**

Students should achieve at least Grade E in their AS subjects in Year 12, or pass the first year of their BTEC course, if they wish to continue into Year 13. The expectation is that students will continue onto 3 A Level courses, in exceptional circumstances students who achieve less than this may continue into Year 13, or repeat Year 12, at the Association's discretion.

### **Age Limits**

Students can only begin courses if they are under 19 years of age on the first day of the term for the ensuing academic year. This means that students may start Year 12, 13 or 14, but may not continue the course or start a subsequent year if they are 19 years of age at the start of the next academic year.
