

Population

Geographical Barriers to Services

Part of the Indices of Deprivation 2015, the Geographical Barriers to Service sub-domain ranks all Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in England in terms of road distances to services including a GP surgery, supermarket or convenience store, primary school and post office.


Large areas of North Yorkshire are covered by LSOAs within the most deprived 20% in England for this measure.

LSOA national quintile





Population density (people per sq km, ONS MYE 2018)



- Population density is higher than the North Yorkshire average but considerably lower than that of England overall.
- Outside of the main towns of Scarborough, Whitby and Filey much of the district is covered by areas which fall within the 20% most deprived neighbourhoods (Lower Super Output Areas) in England in terms of Geographical Barriers to Services. 31.4% of the population live in these very rural areas.
- 2.7% of the LSOAs in Scarborough are within the 10% most deprived in North Yorkshire for this indicator.

- 26.9% of the population are aged 65+, higher than the national average (18.2%) and higher than the North Yorkshire average (24.2%).
- This is expected to increase to 34.4% by 2035 while for North Yorkshire as a whole the proportion is expected to increase to 32.6%.





Health


- 322 people aged 18-64 are thought to have a moderate or severe learning disability in 2019.
- This is expected to fall to 295 by 2035.
- For those aged 65+ the number is expected to increase from 83 to 101 people over the same period.
- These figures are based on national rates applied to the population of the district.
- 409 people have an open service with a Primary Support Reason (PSR) of Learning Disability (Q1 2019/20).

People aged 65+ predicted to have a moderate or severe learning disability in 2019 and in 2035




Population aged 18-64 predicted to have a serious personal care disability



- 571 people aged 18-64 have a serious personal care disability in 2019. This is expected to fall to 496 people by 2035.
- These figures are based on national rates from PANSI which have been applied to the population of the district.
- 1,514 clients have a PSR of either physical or sensory support (Q1 2019/20).
- Of those, 1,259 are for Personal Care. A further 189 are for Access and Mobility Only and an additional 66 are for Sensory Support.

- 58.9% of dementia cases are estimated to have been diagnosed (PHE, 2018).
- This is lower than both the national and North Yorkshire averages.
- The number of people aged 65+ with dementia is expected to increase from 2,047 in 2019 to 2,913 by 2035 (POPPI).
- 279 clients have a recorded health condition of dementia, 225 of which are in permanent placements (Q1 2019/20, LLA).
- 36 providers are currently approved to provide dementia care across the Scarborough, Whitby & Ryedale locality (Q4 2018/19).

Public Health England Profile - key issues for adult social care

- Of those aged 17+ with diabetes 70.4% are estimated to have been diagnosed. This is significantly below the national average (77.1%) in 2017.
- 669.2 people aged 65+ per 100,000 had a hip fracture in 2016/17. This is significantly higher than the national rate (575.0).


Provision

- There are 41 residential homes (886 beds) and 13 nursing homes (458 bed) across Scarborough district (Q4 2018/19).
- Across the Scarborough, Whitby & Ryedale locality residential homes have an occupancy rate of 96% (38 vacancies) while nursing homes have an occupancy rate of 88% (60 vacancies) in Q4 2018/19.
- The number of people aged 65+ living in a care home with or without nursing is projected to increase from 969 in 2019 to 1,501 by 2035, a 54.9% increase (POPPI), the lowest rate of increase in the county.

Rate of hospital discharges into care per 1,000 adults (July 2018 - June 2019)



- 3.8 people per 1,000 adults were discharged from hospital into care in the twelve months to June 2019.
- This equates to 342 clients, the second largest number and the second highest rate in North Yorkshire.
- This is substantially above the North Yorkshire average of 3.0 per 1,000 adults.

- 51 approved residential and nursing care providers operate with Scarborough district.
- 70.6% of those providers who have received a CQC rating were rated good or outstanding Q1 2019/20. This is lower than the county average (76.4%) and the lowest rate in the county.

% Residential & nursing locations rated Good or Outstanding (Q1 2019/20)




% Domiciliary care providers rated Good or Outstanding (Q1 2019/20)



- 21 approved domiciliary care providers operate with Scarborough district
- 71.4% of those providers who have received a CQC rating were rated good or outstanding in Q1 2019/20. This is the second lowest rate in North Yorkshire and considerably lower than the county average (83.0%).

Services


Open weekly services per 1,000 pop aged 65+ (Q1 2019)




- 45.9 people per 1,000 aged 65+ receive a service in Q1 2019/20, the highest rate in the county.
- This equates to 1,346 people accessing care.
- The rate increases to 78.1 at age 75+ and to 164.5 at age 85+, all of which are the highest rates in the county.
- There are 75.4 domiciliary care cases per 10,000 adults, the highest rate in the county and considerably higher than the North Yorkshire average of 52.5.
- 3 domiciliary care packages are unsourced across the Scarborough, Whitby & Ryedale locality from a total of 22 across the county in Q4 2018/19.

- 210.3 people per 1,000 aged 65+ are in residential or nursing care placements.
- This is the highest rate in North Yorkshire and considerably above the county average (145.9).
- Clients with a PSR of 'Physical Support' make up 58.7% of those in residential & nursing placements, lower than the county average (59.7%).
- 3.0% of residential & nursing clients have a PSR of 'social support'. This is the largest proportion in the county.

- 27% of residential & nursing places for ages 65+ are above NYCC rates, substantially fewer than the county average (46%).
- 11% of residential placements are in excess of £1K. This is below the county average (17%).
- 2% of nursing placements are in excess of £1K, amongst the lowest rates in North Yorkshire, which average 17% across the county (LAA, Q1 2019/20).
- The average age at placement is 79.6, below the average age for North Yorkshire (82.4).
- The average duration of residential / nursing services is 2.6 years during Q1 2019/20, longer than the county average (2.5 years).

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
