
Population

Geographical Barriers to Services


Part of the Indices of Deprivation 2015, the Geographical Barriers to Service sub-domain ranks all Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in England in terms of road distances to services including a GP surgery, supermarket or convenience store, primary school and post office.

Large areas of North Yorkshire are covered by LSOAs within the most deprived 20% in England for this measure.


LSOA national quintile


Population density (people per sq km, ONS MYE 2018)



- Population density is higher than in other North Yorkshire districts but considerably lower than that of England overall.
- Outside of the market towns much of the district is covered by areas which fall within the 20% most deprived neighbourhoods (LSOAs) in England in terms of Geographical Barriers to Services. 45.9% of the population live in these very rural areas.
- 5.4% of the LSOAs in Selby are within the 10% most deprived in North Yorkshire for this indicator.

- 20.1% of the population are aged 65+, lower than the North Yorkshire average (24.2%) but higher than the national average (18.2%).
- This is expected to increase to 27.3% by 2035, a smaller increase than the North Yorkshire average, which is expected to reach 32.6%.



Health


- 287 people aged 18-64 are thought to have a moderate or severe learning disability in 2019. This is expected to remain broadly constant through to 2035, with a projected figure of 285 people.
- For those aged 65+ the number is expected to increase from 52 to 71 people over the same period.
- These figures are based on national rates applied to the population of the district.
- 143 people have an open service with a Primary Support Reason (PSR) of Learning Disability (Q1 2019/20).


Population aged 18-64 predicted to have a serious personal care disability



- 489 people aged 18-64 have a serious physical person care disability in 2019. This is expected to fall to 464 people by 2035.
- These figures are based on national rates from PANSI which have been applied to the population of the district.
- 467 clients have a PSR of either physical or sensory support (Q1 2019/20).
- Of those, 40 are for Personal Care. A further 418 are for Access and Mobility Only and an additional 9 for Sensory Support.

- 66.4% of dementia cases are estimated to have been diagnosed (PHE, 2018).
- This is broadly in line with the national and the North Yorkshire averages.
- The number of people aged 65+ with dementia is expected to increase from 1,176 in 2019 to 2,000 by 2035 (POPPI).
- 124 clients have a recorded health condition of dementia, 93 of which are in permanent placements (Q1 2019/20, LLA).
- 18 providers are currently approved to provide dementia care across the Selby locality (Q4 2018/19).

Dementia diagnosis rate, 2018 (% of estimated cases)




Public Health England Profile - key issues for adult social care

- Life expectancy for both men and women is higher than the England average at 80.3 years and 83.9 years respectively in comparison with 79.5 and 83.1 years nationally.
- There were 547.4 hip fractures per 100,000 people in older people (aged 65+) in 2016/17, which was higher than the national rate of 575.0.


Provision

- There are 21 residential homes (377 beds) and 5 nursing homes (287 bed) across Selby district (Q4 2018/19).
- Across Selby district residential homes have an occupancy rate of 91% (27 vacancies) while nursing homes have an occupancy rate of 97% (9 vacancies) in Q4 2018/19.
- The number of people aged 65+ living in a care home with or without nursing is projected to increase from 476 in 2019 to 889 by 2035, a 86.8% increase (POPPI), the greatest rate of increase in the county.

Rate of hospital discharges into care per 1,000 adults (July 2018 - June 2019)



- 1.6 people per 1,000 adults were discharged from hospital into care in the year to June 2019, the lowest rate in the county.
- The rate equates to 115 clients.
- The North Yorkshire average rate for discharge from hospital into care is 3.0 per 1,000 adults.

- 20 approved residential and nursing care providers operate within Selby district.
- 75.0% of those providers who have received a CQC rating were rated good or outstanding Q1 2019/20. This is close to the county average (76.4%).

% Residential & nursing locations rated Good or Outstanding (Q1 2019/20)




% Domiciliary care providers rated Good or Outstanding (Q1 2019/20)



- 9 approved domiciliary care providers operate with Selby district.
- 100% of those providers who have received a CQC rating were rated good or outstanding in Q1 2019/20. This is higher than the North Yorkshire average (83.0%).

Services


Open weekly services per 1,000 pop aged 65+ (Q1 2019)




- 32.7 people per 1,000 aged 65+ receive a service in Q1 2019/20, lower than the county average.
- This equates to 587 people accessing care.
- The rate increases to 64.8 at age 75+ and to 136.2 at age 85+. Both of these rates are close to the county average.
- There are 43.6 domiciliary care cases per 10,000 adults, which is lower than the North Yorkshire average of 52.4.
- There are no unsourced domiciliary care packages within the district in Q4 2018/19. Across the county 22 packages were unsourced.

- 109.3 people per 1,000 aged 65+ are in residential or nursing care placements.
- This is considerably below the North Yorkshire average (145.9).
- Clients with a PSR of 'Physical Support' make up 68.0% of those in residential & nursing placements, higher than the county average (59.7%).
- 1.5% of residential & nursing clients have a PSR of 'social support'. This is below the county average (1.8%).

- 46% of residential & nursing places for ages 65+ are above NYCC rates, in line with the county average (46%).
- 11% of residential placements are in excess of £1K. This is lower than the county average (17%).
- 8% of nursing placements are in excess of £1K. This is considerably lower than the county average of 17% (LAA, Q1 2019/20).
- The average age at placement is 85.2. This is older than the North Yorkshire average (82.4).
- The average duration of residential / nursing services is 2.1 years during Q1 2019/20. This is shorter than county average (2.5 years).
