

### A. Shared Care Drug Misuse Treatment and Recovery Service

The following medicines may be prescribed within this service. Prescribing out-with this formulary will be subject to *prior* agreement with the NYH clinical team, and commissioners, prior to initiation.

- Buprenorphine\_Tab Subling 2mg S/F
- Buprenorphine\_Tab Subling 8mg S/F
- Buprenorph/Naloxone\_TabSubling8mg/2mgSF
- Buprenorphine\_Tab Subling 4mg S/F
- Methadone HCl\_Mix 1mg/1ml
- Methadone HCl\_Mix 1mg/1ml C/F
- Methadone HCl\_Mix 1mg/1ml S/F

Generic prescriptions should be written.

### B. Pharmacological abstinence therapy supervision service for alcohol misuse

The following medicines may be prescribed within this service. Please refer to BNF for doses:

- Acamprosate: 333mg (adults aged 18 years to 65 years; see BNF if weighs <60kgs)
- Naltrexone: 50mg (adults aged 18 years)
- Disulfiram: 200mg

Generic prescriptions should be written.

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### C. Targeted Primary Care Sexual Health Service

The following sets out the NYCC position in relation to products and devices that could be prescribed by GPs as part of the sexual health service that NYCC commission from them.

<b>Intrauterine Contraceptive Systems</b>	
<b>Drug</b>	<b>Indication commissioned for</b>
Mirena (can be prescribed generically)	First choice long acting intrauterine contraceptive system for women requiring contraception for 5 years
Jaydess (can be prescribed generically)	An option for women for whom long acting intrauterine contraception is indicated: Jaydess would be first line if women are requiring contraceptive cover for up to 3

	years; and second line (to Mirena) if 5 years or more contraceptive cover is required.
<b>Exclusions</b>	
Levosert – because the Faculty of Sexual and Reproductive Health product review concludes that Levosert does not appear to confer any additional benefit over Mirena, but it only licensed for 3 years, therefore is more expensive per annum. If the license is extended we will review this position.
