This Order is made by North Yorkshire County Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the Authority that in the interests of the owner(s) of the land crossed by the Public Footpath described in Paragraph 1 of this Order it is expedient that the line of the Path(s) should be diverted.

Mr. & Mrs. H Meggitt, Croft Barn, Clifton Lane, Newall-with-Clifton, Otley, LS21 2HE has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the Path(s) into a fit condition for use by the public.

HARROGATE District Council and Newall with Clifton Parish Council have been consulted as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The public right of way over the land situated at Croft Barn Clifton Lane, Newall With Clifton and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up on the date on which the Authority certifies, in accordance with Section 119(3)(b) of the 1980 Act, that work to the new section of path or way, as described in Part 2 of the Schedule, has been completed to the reasonable satisfaction of the Authority. Under no circumstances shall such certification be given before the date of confirmation of this Order.
- 2. There shall from the date of the above mentioned certification be the PUBLIC FOOTPATH over the land situated at Croft Barn Clifton Lane, Newall With Clifton described in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this Order.
- 3. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF A PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

PUBLIC FOOTPATH 15.97/4 NEWALL WITH CLIFTON DIVERSION ORDER 2022

The above Order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 was confirmed on Friday 04 November 2022.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the Public Footpath as follows:

Public Footpath 15.97/4 running generally south-eastwards between SE 1916 4825 and SE 1923 4822 (Points A & B on the Plan), will be diverted onto the used alignment from SE 1916 4825 generally eastwards to SE 1923 4823, then southwards to SE 1923 4822 (A—C—E—B on the Plan).

A copy of the order as confirmed and the Order Map have been placed and may be seen free of charge during normal office hours at Harrogate Library, Victoria Avenue, Harrogate HG1 1EG, North Yorkshire until Thursday 05 January 2023. The Order comes into force on the date on which the Authority certifies, in accordance with Section 119(3)(b) of the 1980 Act, that work to the new section of path, described in Part 2 of the Schedule, has been completed, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under Paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by Paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from Thursday 17 November 2022, make an application to the High Court.
