

NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BEECH GROVE/ LANCASTER ROAD, HARROGATE) (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)
EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

North Yorkshire County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby make the following Order:

1. No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed along those lengths of road specified in columns 2 and 3 set out in Schedule 1 to this Order during the times specified other than:
 - (a) A vehicle being used in the course of an emergency by emergency services vehicles
 - (b) To enable the vehicle (if it cannot reasonably be used for the same purpose in any other road) to be used in connection with any of the following operations in an emergency; building works; the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road; the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the road by an undertaker of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus
 - (c) A vehicle in the service of a local authority being used in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties and if that vehicle cannot reasonably be used for the same purpose in any other road.
2. No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, or of a civil enforcement officer, cause or permit any motor vehicle other than an operational ambulance to stop or wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to stop or wait in any of the lengths of road to which that Article applies if it is necessary to do so to enable:-
 - (a) Building, industrial or demolition operations
 - (b) The removal of any obstruction to traffic
 - (c) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any length of Road specified in the said Schedule or
 - (d) The laying, erection, alteration or repair, in or in land adjacent to, any length of Road specified in the said Schedule of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (e) The delivery or collection of postal packets as defined in Section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953 at or from premises fronting any length of road specified in the said Schedule
 - (f) The motor vehicle to be used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or
 - (g) The motor vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties or in connection with any building operation or wire or cable or any apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (h) The motor vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to any length of road specified in the said Schedule for so long as is reasonably necessary to enable

the motor vehicle to be used for or in connection with the purposes of any wedding or funeral taking or to take place from or at any such premises; or

- (i) The motor vehicle to be loaded or unloaded whilst actually in use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling-house to another, or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository.

4. The Council are satisfied that:-

- (a) For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- (b) For facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians), or
- (c) For preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs;

it is requisite that Section 3(1)(b) of the Act should not apply in relation to this Order

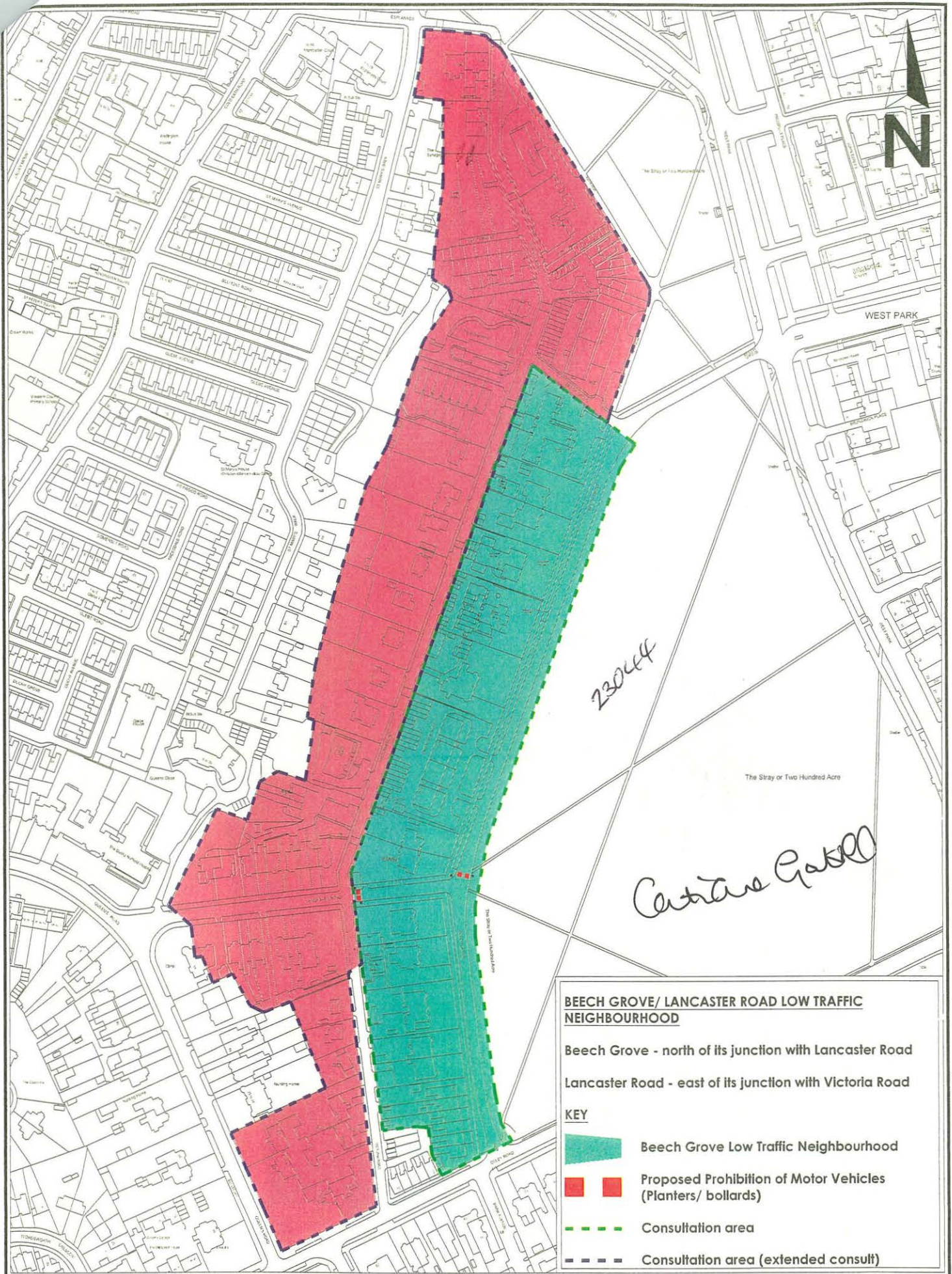
5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any Order or regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

6. This Order shall come into operation on **15 February 2021 for an experimental period of up to 18 months** and may be cited as "North Yorkshire County Council (Beech Grove/Lancaster Road) Experimental Prohibition of Driving Order 2021

SCHEDULE 1

PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

<u>Column 1 Item</u>	<u>Column 2 Road</u>	<u>Column 3 Length</u>
1.	Beech Grove (U61), Harrogate	From a point 22 metres south west of the intersection point of the projected north east boundary line of No.12 Beech Grove with the north west kerb line of Beech Grove to a point 24 metres south west of the intersection point of the projected north east boundary line of No.12 Beech Grove with the north west kerb line of Beech Grove.
2.	Lancaster Road (U438), Harrogate	From a point 7 metres east of the projected centre line of Victoria Road to a point 9 metres east of the projected centre line of Victoria Road.



BEECH GROVE/ LANCASTER ROAD LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD

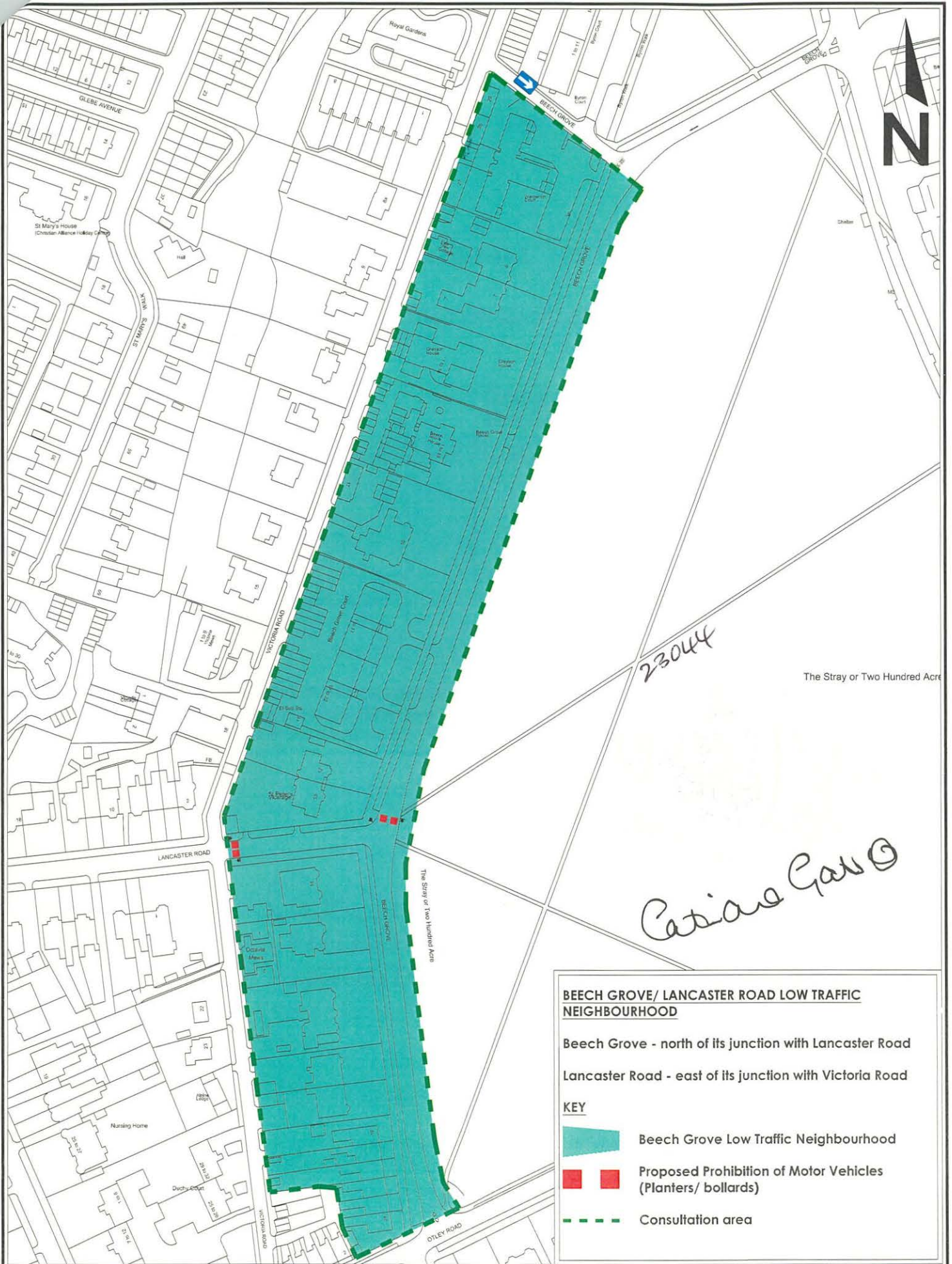
