

**NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BEECH GROVE/LANCASTER ROAD, HARROGATE) (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)
EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021**

NOTICE is hereby given that on 29 01 2021 North Yorkshire County Council made an Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, the effect of which is to prohibit any motor vehicle from proceeding along those lengths of road described in Schedule 1, below, and stop or wait in those lengths of road described in Schedule 2, below, except for those circumstances detailed in the said Order.

**SCHEDULE 1
PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES**

Beech Grove (U61), Harrogate, from a point 22 metres south west of the intersection point of Harrogate the projected north east boundary line of No.12 Beech Grove with the north west kerb line of Beech Grove to a point 24 metres south west of the intersection point of the projected north east boundary line of No.12 Beech Grove with the north west kerb line of Beech Grove; Lancaster Road (U438), from a point 7 metres east of the projected centre line of Harrogate Victoria Road to a point 9 metres east of the projected centre line of Victoria Road.

**SCHEDULE 2
PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND STOPPING EXCEPT AMBULANCES AT ALL TIMES**

Trinity Road (U790), Harrogate, North east side, from a point 9.6 metres south east of its intersection point with the south east kerb line of Otley Road (B6162) for a distance of 7.8 metres in a south easterly direction.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on **15 February 2021**, together with a map showing the roads affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton, during normal office hours between 04 02 2021 and 14 08 2021 and also available to be viewed online at www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map or <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders>. The County Council will be considering, in due course, whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within a period of six months from the coming into force of the Order, or if the Order is subsequently varied or modified, from the coming into operation of that variation or modification (whichever is the later), any person may object to the making of an Order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation.

Any person wishing to object to the indefinite continuation of the Order must state the grounds for their objection, in writing, addressed to Area 6 Highways Office, Stump Cross, Boroughbridge YO51 9HU or by email to area6.boroughbridge@northyorks.gov.uk or via the website link by 14 08 2021.

If you wish to question the validity of the above Experimental Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of 29 01 2021 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
