(PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING AND PROVISION OF PARKING)
(BOROUGH OF SCARBOROUGH)
(AMENDMENT NO 103) ORDER 2021

NOTICE is hereby given that on 16 February 2021 North Yorkshire County Council made an Order under Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32(1) and 35(1) and 45 to 49 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act and under the Traffic Management Act 2004, the effect of which is to amend “North Yorkshire County Council (Prohibition of Waiting and Loading and Provision of Parking) (Borough of Scarborough) Consolidation Order 2011” by introducing the parking charges on Royal Albert Drive, Scarborough as specified in the table below:-

PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING AND PROVISION OF PARKING

AMENDMENT TO PARKING CHARGES

PAY AND DISPLAY PARKING BAY BETWEEN 1ST MARCH AND 31ST OCTOBER 9AM TO 6PM

Royal Albert Drive (South West Side) –

From a point adjacent to the north west boundary of the Watermark café to a point 17 metres south east of the north west boundary of the Oasis café.

From a point 34 metres south east of the north west boundary of the Watermark café to a point 15 metres north west of its junction with Albert Road..

From a point 10 metres south east of its junction with Albert Road to its junction with Marine Drive.

High Season - March to October (inclusive)

£2.20 for up to 1 hour

£4.40 for up to 3 hours

£7.00 for up to 6 hours

£9.00 for up to 24 hours

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 1 March 2021, together with a map showing the roads affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton and at during normal office hours from 18 February 2021 to 30 March 2021 and also viewed online at www.northyorks.gov.uk/roadworks-map or <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/traffic-regulation-orders>

If you wish to question the validity of the above Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of 16 February 2021 make application to the High Court for the purpose.
