

# SELBY DISTRICT COUNCIL COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY

## **ANNUAL REPORT 2017/18**

#### 1. Introduction

This is the CIL Annual Report prepared by Selby District Council.

The Community Infrastructure Levy was adopted by Selby District Council on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016 following a successful inspection in December 2015. Details can be found on the District Councils website including the Charging Schedule – www.selby.gov.uk

This covers the reporting year 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018.

The charges for Selby District are set out in the Community Infrastructure Levy Charging Schedule which was approved and published in accordance with the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 (as amended) and Part 11 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended by Part 6 of the Localism Act 2011) and came into effect on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016.

The levy is chargeable on any liable development that has received planning permission on or after the date the Charging Schedule came into effect.

For the period covered by this Annual Report only one Parish Council in Selby District had an adopted Neighbourhood plan. Therefore funds passed onto this local council (Appleton Roebuck and Acaster Selby) have been calculated at the 25% share of CIL receipts, with the remaining local councils receiving 15% share. This is the meaningful proportion.

Systems have been put in place for the recording of CIL receipts and expenditure. A CIL and Section 106 monitoring officer was appointed in December 2015.

This report complies with the requirements of Regulation 62 of the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 (as amended) and contains the following information.

#### 1. The CIL Charge

The Community Infrastructure Levy is covered by the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 which have been amended in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Guidance has also been produced.

The levy is a means by which Local Authorities can raise funds from developers undertaking new development in their area. The money raised can be used to fund infrastructure that is needed as a result of development in their area.

The Charging Schedule sets out the charges and this was subject to consultation and inspection prior to adoption.

CIL was adopted by Selby District Council on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016 with all chargeable development, granted planning permission on or after 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016 being liable for the CIL charge as set out in the adopted Charging Schedule.

The charges set out in the Charging Schedule are
