INTRODUCTION

- 1 The Council is the local planning authority for the purposes of the Act for the area in which the Site is situated.
- 2 The Owner is the freehold owner of the Land with title absolute under the Land Registry title number NYK407982
- 3 The Owner has submitted the Application to the Council and the parties have agreed to enter into this Deed in order to secure the planning obligations contained in this Deed.
- 4 The Council resolved on 30 July 2014 to grant the Planning Permission subject to the prior completion of this Deed.

NOW THIS DEED WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:

OPERATIVE PART

1 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Deed the following expressions shall have the following meanings:

"Act"

the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

"Application"

the application for outline planning permission dated 3 June 2014 submitted to the Council for the Development and allocated reference number 14/00593/FUL.

"Commencement of Development" the date on which any material operation (as defined

in Section 56(4) of the Act) forming part of the Development begins to be carried out other than (for the purposes of this Deed and for no other purpose) operations consisting of site clearance, demolition work, archaeological investigations, investigations for the purpose of assessing ground conditions, remedial work in respect of any contamination or other adverse ground conditions, diversion and laying of services, erection of any temporary means

of enclosure, the temporary display of site notices or advertisements and "Commence Development" shall be construed accordingly.

"Development"

the Development of the Site with demolition of existing dwelling and agricultural buildings to allow erection of 1no four bedroom replacement dwelling with detached double garage, erection of two storey and single storey extensions to existing farmhouse to form a five bedroom dwelling following demolition of single storey outbuildings and erection of a terrace of 3no three bedroom dwellings with block of 3no detached garages as set out in the Application.

"Dwelling"

any dwelling (including a house flat or maisonette) to be constructed pursuant to the Planning Permission and 'first Dwelling' shall be construed accordingly

"Index"

All Items Index of Retail Prices issued by the Office

for National Statistics.

"Interest"

interest at 4 per cent above the base lending rate of the National Westminster Bank Plc from time to

time

"Land"

means the land at Village Farm, Goose Track Lane, West Lilling, York, North Yorkshire, YO60 6RP which for the purposes of identification shown edged

in red on the Plan.

"Open Space Commuted Sum"

the sum of £6525.00 to be used by the Council in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 of the

Fourth Schedule.

"Plan"

the plan attached to this Deed.

"Planning Permission"

the outline planning permission subject to conditions to be granted by the Council pursuant to the Application as set out in the Second Schedule.

"Practical Completion"

Means the completion of all the construction of the dwelling that has to be done, notwithstanding that there may be latent defects, for the purpose of allowing a prospective purchaser to take possession

of the dwelling and use it as intended.

"Site"

the land against which this Deed may be enforced

as shown edged red on the Plan.

2 CONSTRUCTION OF THIS DEED

2.1 Where in this Deed reference is made to any clause, paragraph or schedule or recital such reference (unless the context otherwise requires) is a reference to a clause, paragraph or schedule or recital in this Deed.

- 2.2 Words importing the singular meaning where the context so admits include the plural meaning and vice versa.
- 2.3 Words of the masculine gender include the feminine and neuter genders and words denoting actual persons include companies, corporations and firms and all such words shall be construed interchangeable in that manner.
- 2.4 Wherever there is more than one person named as a party and where more than one party undertakes an obligation all their obligations can be enforced against all of them jointly and severally unless there is an express provision otherwise.
- 2.5 Any reference to an Act of Parliament shall include any modification, extension or reenactment of that Act for the time being in force and shall include all instruments, orders, plans regulations, permissions and directions for the time being made, issued or given under that Act or deriving validity from it.
- 2.6 References to any party to this Deed shall include the successors in title to that party and to any person deriving title through or under that party and in the case of the Council and County Council the successors to their respective statutory functions.
- 2.7 The headings and contents list are for reference only and shall not affect construction.

3 LEGAL BASIS

- 3.1 This Deed is made pursuant to Section 106 of the Act Section 111 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Section 2 of the Local Government Act 2000 and Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 and all other enabling powers.
- 3.2 The covenants, restrictions and requirements imposed upon the Owner under this Deed create planning obligations pursuant to Section 106 of the Act and are enforceable by the Council as local planning authority against the Owner.

4 CONDITIONALITY

This Deed is conditional upon:

- (i) the grant of the Planning Permission; and
- (ii) the Commencement of Development

save for the provisions of Clauses 8.1, 10, 14, 15 and 16 which shall come into effect immediately upon completion of this Deed.

5 THE OWNER'S COVENANTS

5.1 The Owner covenants with the Council as set out in the Third Schedule.

6 THE COUNCIL'S COVENANTS

6.1 The Council covenants with the Owner as set out in the Fourth Schedule.

8 MISCELLANEOUS

- 8.1 The Owner shall pay to the Council on completion of this Deed the reasonable legal costs of the Council incurred in the negotiation, preparation and execution of this Deed.
- 8.2 No provisions of this Deed shall be enforceable under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999
- 8.3 This Deed shall be registrable as a local land charge by the Council.

- 8.4 Where the agreement, approval, consent or expression of satisfaction is required by the Owner from the Council under the terms of this Deed such agreement, approval or consent or expression of satisfaction shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed and any such agreement, consent, approval or expression of satisfaction shall be given on behalf of:
 - (i) the Council by the Council Solicitor;

And any notices shall be deemed to have been properly served if sent by recorded delivery to the principal address or registered office (as appropriate) of the relevant party.

- 8.5 Following the performance and satisfaction of all the obligations contained in this Deed the Council shall forthwith effect the cancellation of all entries made in the Register of Local Land Charges in respect of this Deed.
- 8.6 Insofar as any clause or clauses of this Deed are found (for whatever reason) to be invalid illegal or unenforceable then such invalidity illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Deed.
- 8.7 This Deed shall cease to have effect (insofar only as it has not already been complied with) if the Planning Permission shall be quashed, revoked or otherwise withdrawn or (without the consent of the Owner) it is modified by any statutory procedure or expires prior to the Commencement of Development.
- 8.8 No person shall be liable for any breach of any of the planning obligations or other provisions of this Deed after it shall have parted with its entire interest in the Site but without prejudice to liability for any subsisting breach arising prior to parting with such interest
- 8.9 This Deed shall not be enforceable against owner-occupiers or tenants of dwellings constructed pursuant to the Planning Permission nor against those deriving title from them.
- 8.10 Nothing in this Deed shall prohibit or limit the right to develop any part of the Site in accordance with a planning permission (other than the Planning Permission) granted (whether or not on appeal) after the date of this Deed.
- 8.11 Nothing contained or implied in this Deed shall prejudice or affect the rights discretions powers duties and obligations of the Council under all statutes by-laws statutory instruments orders and regulations in the exercise of their functions as a local authority.

9 WAIVER

No waiver (whether expressed or implied) by the Council or Owner of any breach or default in performing or observing any of the covenants terms or conditions of this Deed shall constitute a continuing waiver and no such waiver shall prevent the Council or Owner from enforcing any of the relevant terms or conditions or for acting upon any subsequent breach or default.

10 CHANGE IN OWNERSHIP

The Owner agrees with the Council to give the Council immediate written notice of any change in ownership of any of its interests in the Site occurring before all the obligations under this Deed have been discharged such notice to give details of the transferee's full

name and registered office (if a company or usual address if not) together with the area of the Site or unit of occupation purchased by reference to a plan.

11 INDEXATION

Any sum referred to in the Third Schedule shall be increased by an amount equivalent to the increase in the Index from the date hereof until the date on which such sum is payable.

12 INTEREST

If any payment due under this Deed is paid late, Interest will be payable from the date payment is due to the date of payment.

13 VAT

All consideration given in accordance with the terms of this Deed shall be exclusive of any value added tax properly payable.

14 DISPUTE PROVISIONS

- In the event of any dispute or difference arising between any of the parties to this Deed in respect of any matter contained in this Deed such dispute or difference shall be referred to an independent and suitable person holding appropriate professional qualifications to be appointed (in the absence of an agreement) by or on behalf of the president for the time being of the professional body chiefly relevant in England with such matters as may be in dispute and such person shall act as an expert whose decision shall be final and binding on the parties in the absence of manifest error and any costs shall be payable by the parties to the dispute in such proportion as the expert shall determine and failing such determination shall be borne by the parties in equal shares.
- 14.2 In the absence of agreement as to the appointment or suitability of the person to be appointed pursuant to Clause 15.1 or as to the appropriateness of the professional body then such question may be referred by either part to the president for the time being of the Law Society for him to appoint a solicitor to determine the dispute such solicitor acting as an expert and his decision shall be final and binding on all parties in the absence of manifest error and his costs shall be payable by the parties to the dispute in such proportion as he shall determine and failing such determination shall be borne by the parties in equal shares.
- 14.3 Any expert howsoever appointed shall be subject to the express requirement that a decision was reached and communicated to the relevant parties within the minimum practicable timescale allowing for the nature and complexity of the dispute and in any event not more than twenty-eight working days after the conclusion of any hearing that takes place or twenty-eight working days after he has received any file or written representation.
- 14.4 The expert shall be required to give notice to each of the said parties requiring them to submit to him within ten working days of notification of his appointment written submissions and supporting material and the other party will be entitled to make a counter written submission within a further ten working days.
- 14.5 The provisions of this clause shall not affect the ability of the Council to apply for and be granted any of the following: declaratory relief, injunction, specific performance,

payment of any sum, damages, any other means of enforcing this Deed and consequential and interim orders and relief.

15 JURISDICTION

This Deed is governed by and interpreted in accordance with the law of England and Wales and the parties submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.

16 DELIVERY

The provisions of this Deed (other than this clause which shall be of immediate effect) shall be of no effect until this Deed has been dated.

01 The development hereby permitted shall be begun on or before.

Reason:- To ensure compliance with Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004

Before the development hereby permitted is commenced, or such longer period as may be agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority, details and samples of the materials to be used on the exterior of the building the subject of this permission shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory external appearance and to satisfy the requirements of Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

Prior to the commencement of the development hereby permitted, the developer shall construct on site for the written approval of the Local Planning Authority, a one metre square free standing panel of the external walling to be used in the construction of building. The panel so constructed shall be retained only until the development has been completed

Reason: To ensure a satisfactory external appearance and to satisfy the requirements of Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

Before the commencement of the development hereby permitted, or such longer period as may be agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority, full details of the materials and design of all means of enclosure shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Thereafter these shall be erected prior to the occupation of any dwelling to which they relate.

Reason:- To ensure that the development does not prejudice the enjoyment by the neighbouring occupiers of their properties or the appearance of the locality, as required by Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

Before any part of the development hereby approved commences, plans showing details of landscaping and planting schemes shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The schemes shall provide for the planting of trees and shrubs and show areas to be grass seeded or turfed where appropriate to the development. The submitted plans and/or accompanying schedules shall indicate numbers, species, heights on planting, and positions of all trees and shrubs including existing items to be retained.. All planting, seeding and/or turfing comprised in the above scheme shall be carried out in the first planting season following the commencement of the development, or such longer period as may be agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Any trees or shrubs which, within a period of five years from being planted, die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar sizes and species, unless the Local Planning Authority gives written consent to any variation.

Reason: To enhance the appearance of the development hereby approved and to comply with the requirements of Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

- 06 The 3 no. terraced dwellings hereby approved shall only be occupied by a person(s) including their spouse and any dependants who:
 - Have permanently resided in the Parish, or adjoining parish, for at least three years and are now in need of new accommodation, which cannot be met from the existing housing stock; or
 - Do not live in the Parish but have a long standing connection to the local community, including a previous period of residence of over three years but have moved away in the past three years; or service men or women returning to the parish after leaving military service; or
 - Are taking up full time permanent employment in an already established business which has been located within the parish, or adjoining parish, for at least the previous three years; or
 - Have an essential need arising from age or infirmity to move to be near relatives who have been permanently resident within the District for at least the previous three years.

Reason:- To meet the requirements of Policies SP2 and SP21 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

No development shall commence on site until further details of finished ground floor levels in relation to a measurable datum point have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The development shall thereafter only be carried out in accordance with the approved levels details.

Reason: To ensure that the appearance of the area is not prejudiced and to satisfy Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

O8 Prior to the commencement of the development precise details of the means of draining foul water, including percolation tests shall be submitted to an approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: In order to ensure that the site can be effectively drained and to comply with Policy SP3 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

Prior to the commencement of the development, details of all windows, doors and garage doors, including means of opening, depth of reveal and external finish shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority

Reason: To ensure an appropriate appearance and to comply with the requirements of Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

Prior to the commencement of development hereby approved, precise details of the ground surfacing materials shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: In order to ensure a satisfactory external appearance and to satisfy Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

Unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority, development shall not commence until actual or potential land contamination at the site has been investigated and a Phase 1 Desk Study Report has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Should further intrusive investigation be recommended in the Phase 1 Report or be required by the Local Planning Authority, development shall not commence until a Phase 2 Site Investigation Report and if required, or requested by the Local Planning Authority, a Remediation Statement have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Reports shall be prepared in accordance with Contaminated Land Report 11 and BS 10175(2011) Code of Practice for the Investigation of Potential Contaminated Sites. Submission of a verification report to be approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority will be required on the completion of any remedial work.

Reason: In order to fully assess potential ground contamination and to satisfy National Planning Policy Framework.

12 The development shall be undertaken in accordance with Section 7.3 of the Bat Activity Report dated May 2014 with precise details to be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority, prior to commencement of the development.

Reason:- In order to take account of protected species and to satisfy Policy SP14 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy.

- Unless otherwise approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority, there shall be no excavation or other groundworks, except for investigative works, or the depositing of material on the site until the access(es) to the site have been set out and constructed in accordance with the published Specification of the Highway Authority and the following requirements:
 - (i) The details of the access shall have been approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority.
 - (ii)(a) The access shall be modified and formed in accordance with approved drawing no. 02 D revised July 2014, and the crossing of the highway verge and that part of the access road extending 6 metres into the site shall be constructed in accordance with Standard Detail number DC/E9A.
 - (iii) Any gates or barriers shall be erected a minimum distance of 6 metres back from the carriageway of the existing highway and shall not be able to swing over the existing or proposed highway.
 - (v) Provision to prevent surface water from the site/plot discharging onto the existing or proposed highway in accordance with the approved details shown on drawing and maintained thereafter to prevent such discharges.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and to ensure a satisfactory means of access to the site from the public highway in the interests of vehicle and pedestrian safety and convenience.

No part of the development shall be brought into use until the existing access on to Goose Track Lane has been permanently closed off and the highway restored. These works shall be in accordance with details which have been approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority. No new access shall be created without the written approval of the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and in the interests of highway safety.

There shall be no access or egress by any vehicles between the highway and the application site (except for the purposes of constructing the initial site access) until splays are provided as shown on approved drawing number 02 D rev. July 2014. The eye height will be 1.05 metres and the object height shall be 0.6 metres. Once created, these visibility areas shall be maintained clear of any obstruction and retained for their intended purpose at all times.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and in the interests of road safety.

- Unless otherwise approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority, there shall be no excavation or other groundworks, except for investigative works, or the depositing of material on the site in connection with the construction of the access road or building(s) or other works until:
 - (iii) A programme for the completion of the proposed works as been submitted.

The required highway impro ements shall include:

(a) Provision of a 1.2 metre width footway linking into the existing footway at the western extremity of the site extending to the proposed access serving the 3 new dwellings and Yew Tree House as shown on approved drawing number 02 D rev. July 2014 and constructed in accordance with the Specification of the highway authority and Standard Detail number E6.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and to ensure that the details are satisfactory in the interests of the safety and convenience of highway users.

Unless otherwise approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority, the development shall not be brought into use until the following highway works have been constructed in accordance with the details approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority under condition number 16:

Provision of 1.2 metre wide footway as fully described in condition no.16

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and in the interests of the safety and convenience of highway users.

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No dwelling shall be occupied until the related parking facilities have been constructed in accordance with the approved drawing number 02 D rev. July 2014. Once created, these parking areas shall be maintained clear of any obstruction and retained for their intended purpose at all times.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan – Local Plan Strategy and to provide for adequate and satisfactory provision of off-street accommodation for vehicles in the interests of safety and the general amenity of the development.

There shall be no access or egress by any vehicles between the highway and the application site until details of the precautions to be taken to prevent the deposit of mud, grit and dirt on public highways by vehicles travelling to and from the site have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority. These facilities shall include the provision of wheel washing facilities where considered necessary by the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority. These precautions shall be made available before any excavation or depositing of material in connection with the construction commences on the site, and be kept available and in full working order and used until such time as the Local Planning Authority in consultation with the Highway Authority agrees in writing to their withdrawal.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and to ensure that no mud or other debris is deposited on the carriageway in the interests of highway safety.

- Unless approved otherwise in writing by the Local Planning Authority, there shall be no establishment on a site compound, site clearance, demolition, excavation or depositing of material in connection with the construction of the site, until proposals have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority for the provision of:
 - (i) on-site parking capable of accommodating all staff and sub-contractors vehicles clear of the public highway
 - (ii) on-site materials storage area capable of accommodating all materials required for the operation of the site.

The approved areas shall be kept available for their intended use at all times that construction works are in operation. No vehicles associated with on-site construction works shall be parked on the public highway or outside the application site.

Reason:- In accordance with Policy SP20 of the Ryedale Plan - Local Plan Strategy and to provide for appropriate on-site vehicle parking and the storage facilities, in the interests of highway safety and the general amenity of the area.

As such, the Local Authority has taken steps to work proactively with the applicant to seek solutions to problems that may have arisen in dealing with this application with a view to improving local economic, social and environmental conditions.
